This workshop introduces the Linux command line interface (CLI) that is used by system administrators, software developers, and power users. The basics of navigating, file manipulation, text editing, and system commands and associated options will be covered. In addition, topics including piping, globbing, man pages, and remote access and file transfer features will be discussed to acquaint attendees with the common options used by Open Source contributors to manage projects.

Basics of the Linux file system; navigating directories and listing files; creating, editing, moving, and deleting files; formatting commands and using options; globbing and quoting; man and info pages.
