- All produce must be grown by the exhibitor with the exception of those classes marked with an asterisk*. Pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least two months.
- All vegetables must be washed and all brassicas must have roots.
- 4. The Judges decision is final in all matters.
- Exhibitors must stage their entries between 10.00 am and 11.15 am on the day of show. All exhibitors must leave the hall by 11.30 am
- 6. No entries will be accepted on the day of show.
- The committee will not be held responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit, vases etc.
- 8. All vases and paper plates will be made available for exhibits.
- The committee will decide on any matter not provided by the above rules.
- The donation of exhibits for auction is welcomed and appreciated for Show Funds.
- 11. Exhibits not offered for auction should be removed by 4.00pm.
- 12. All awards will be retained by winners, except the trophies awarded for Best Garden, Best Allotment & Best in Show which will be returned for the next Show.

The award for Best in Show will be made to the individual accumulating most points throughout the various classes, i.e. 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point
