MS Word does the best job in giving a clear overview of the amount of comments and which sections are commented upon. Compared to LO, the lines are fainter, the font smaller, and importantly, the comments section is much wider. This width is more natural to read at than the one in LO. The width gives room to have a small icon, which makes it easier to keep authors apart when there are many authors in the same document (could be optional). A key feature is that date and the reply button only appears on mouseover, making it look much less cluttered, which is instrumental to get a good overview of the comments.
