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Report of Independent Accountant

To the Management of Korea Electronic Certification Authority, Inc.:

We have examined the <u>assertion</u> by the management of Korea Electronic Certification Authority, Inc. (CrossCert) that in providing its Certification Authority (CA) services at Republic of Korea, CrossCert-CA, during the period July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, CrossCert has

 - o CA systems development, maintenance, and operations are properly authorized and performed to maintain CA systems integrity

based on the AICPA/CICA Trust Services Criteria for Certification Authorities.

CrossCert-CA's management is responsible for its assertion. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on management's assertion based on our examination.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and accordingly, included (1) obtaining an understanding of CrossCert-CA's key and certificate life cycle management business practices and its controls over key and certificate integrity, over the authenticity and privacy of subscriber and relying party information, over the continuity of key and certificate life cycle management operations, and over the development, maintenance, and operation of systems integrity; (2) selectively testing transactions executed in accordance with disclosed key and certificate life cycle management business practices; (3) testing and evaluating the operating effectiveness of the controls; and (4) performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our examination provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.



The relative effectiveness and significance of specific controls at CrossCert-CA and their effect on assessments of control risk for subscribers and relying parties are dependent on their interaction with the controls and other factors present at individual subscriber and relying party locations. We have performed no procedures to evaluate the effectiveness of controls at individual subscriber and relying party locations.

Because of the nature and inherent limitations of controls, CrossCert-CA's ability to meet the aforementioned criteria may be affected. For example, controls may not prevent, or detect and correct, error, fraud, unauthorized access to systems and information, or failure to comply with internal and external policies or requirements. Also, the projection of any conclusions based on our findings to future periods is subject to the risk that changes may alter the validity of such conclusions.

In our opinion, for the period July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, CrossCert-CA management's assertion, as set forth in the first paragraph, is fairly stated, in all material respects, based on the AICPA/CICA *Trust Services Criteria for Certification Authorities*.

This report does not include any representation as to the quality of CrossCert-CA's services beyond those covered by the *Trust Services Criteria for Certification Authorities*, nor the suitability of any of CrossCert-CA's services for any customer's intended purpose.

- Subscriber registration
- Certificate rekey
- Certificate issuance
- Certificate distribution (using an online repository)
- Certificate revocation, and
- Certificate status information processing (using an online repository)

Management of CrossCert-CA is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective controls over its CA operations, including <u>CA business practices disclosure</u>, service integrity (including key and certificate life cycle management controls), and CA environmental controls. These controls contain monitoring mechanisms, and actions are taken to correct deficiencies identified.

Controls have inherent limitations, including the possibility of human error and the circumvention or overriding of controls.
