Main advice –switch off when not in use /update antivirus regularly /do not open attachments unless you trust them /beware of phishing emails /look for the padlock symbol following https:/// do not use public sites for banking /do not disclose personal data / use privacy settings on Facebook to be safe on line / use Facebook wisely "I am 21 today" tells reader your birth date.

- Do not click links on texts / BT and BT antivirus good match / Beware of pop-ups to take premium package / Android phones may not always roll out new systems quickly / Apple computers now becoming so popular that anti virus software may be needed soon /ls Norton Anti-virus is worth keeping / changing passwords , perhaps better to set up a very strong password and stick with it.
- Home security and generally if your suspicions are aroused dial 101 to report to the Police

Greenheys land

- The Council are proposing via an advert in the Bury Times 2/3/17 to dispose of 14 parcels of land. One of these (two plots) adjoin Greenheys Crescent. One reason for the disposal is so the Council no longer needs to maintain the site by cutting the grass etc.
