Stegoceras, a pachycephalosaurid (dome-headed) dinosaur, lived in what is now North America during the Late Cretaceous period, about 77.5 to 74 million years ago. (This genus is unrelated to Stegosaurus, which lived more than 70 million years earlier.) Small and bipedal, Stegoceras was about 2 to 2.5 metres (6.6 to 8.2 ft) long and weighed around 10 to 40 kilograms (22 to 88 lb). It had a rigid vertebral column and a stiffened tail. The pelvic region was broad, perhaps due to an extended gut. The skull was roughly triangular with a short snout, topped by a thick, broad, and relatively smooth dome. The skull jutted out in the back over the occiput, and had a thick ridge over the eyes. The teeth were small and serrated. The skull is thought to have been flat in juvenile animals, growing into a dome with age. The dome may have been used for combat, display, or recognition. Specimens have been found in the Dinosaur Park and Oldman Formations in Alberta, and the Fruitland and Kirtland Formations in the US. (Full article...)

- <u>1233</u> <u>Mongol–Jin War</u>: The <u>Mongols</u> <u>captured Kaifeng</u>, the capital of the <u>Jin dynasty</u>, after besieging it for months.
- <u>1815</u> <u>Napoleon Bonaparte</u> escaped from <u>Elba</u> (*return pictured*), an island off the coast of Italy, where he had been exiled after the signing of the <u>Treaty</u> of Fontainebleau one year earlier.
- <u>1914</u> <u>HMHS *Britannic*</u>, the third and largest <u>Olympic</u>-class ocean <u>liner</u> of the <u>White Star Line</u> after <u>RMS Olympic</u> and <u>RMS Titanic</u>, was launched at the <u>Harland and Wolff</u> shipyard in <u>Belfast</u>.

Shahid Kapoor

Shahid Kapoor's filmography includes starring roles in Hindi films, hosting duties for award ceremonies, and music video appearances. As a dancer in **Shiamak** Davar's institute. Kap oor made uncredited appearances as a background dancer in the films *Dil To Pagal Hai* (1997) and *Taal* (1999). He also appeared in several music videos, including one for the singer Kumar Sanu, before making his acting debut with a lead role in Ken Ghosh's romantic comedy Isha Vishk (2003). He followed it by playing a prospective groom in *Vivah* (2006) and an uptight businessman in *Jab We Met* (2007). In 2009, Kapoor portrayed twin brothers, one with a <u>lisp</u> and the other with a <u>stutter</u>, in <u>Vishal Bhardwai</u>'s acclaimed caper thriller *Kaminey*. After a series of commercial failures, he starred in the 2013 action-drama R... Rajkumar, and followed it by playing the title character in Bhardwaj's Haider (2014), an adaptation of William Shakespeare's tragedy *Hamlet*, which won him the Filmfare Award for Best Actor. In 2016, he played a rockstar addicted to drugs in *Udta Punjab*, for which he won the Filmfare Critics Award for Best Actor. Kapoor has hosted eight award ceremonies, and in 2015 he featured as a talent judge on the dance reality show Jhalak Dikhhla Jaa Reloaded. (Full list...)
