**Stegoceras**, a pachy cephalosaurid (dome-headed) dinosaur, lived in what is now North America during the Late Cretaceous period, about 77.5 to 74 million years ago. (This genus is unrelated to *Stegosaurus*, which lived more than 70 million years earlier.) Small and bipedal, Stegoceras was about 2 to 2.5 metres (6.6 to 8.2 ft) long and weighed around 10 to 40 kilograms (22 to 88 lb). It had a rigid vertebral column and a stiffened tail. The pelvic region was broad, perhaps due to an extended gut. The skull was roughly triangular with a short snout, topped by a thick, broad, and relatively smooth dome. The skull jutted out in the back over the occiput, and had a thick ridge over the eyes. The teeth were small and serrated. The skull is thought to have been flat in juvenile

animals, growing into a dome with age. The dome may have been used for combat, <u>display</u>, or <u>recognition</u>. Specimens have been found in the <u>Dinosaur Park</u> and <u>Oldman Formations</u> in <u>Alberta</u>, and the <u>Fruitland</u> and <u>Kirtland</u> <u>Formations</u> in the US. • <u>1233</u> – <u>Mongol–Jin War</u>: The <u>Mongols</u> captured Kaifeng, the capital of the <u>Jin</u>

- dynasty, after besieging it for months.
- <u>1815</u> <u>Napoleon Bonaparte</u> escaped from <u>Elba</u> (*return pictured*), an island off the coast of Italy, where he had been exiled after the signing of the <u>Treaty of</u> <u>Fontainebleau</u> one year earlier.
- 1914 HMHS *Britannic*, the third and largest *Olympic*-class ocean liner of the White Star Line after RMS *Olympic* and RMS *Titanic*, was launched at the <u>Harland</u> and Wolff shipyard in <u>Belfast</u>.
- 1935 With the aid of a radio station in Daventry, England, and two receiving antennas, Scottish engineer and inventor Robert Watson-Watt first demonstrated the use of radar.

Shahid Kapoor

**Shahid Kapoor's filmography** includes starring roles in Hindi films, hosting duties for award ceremonies, and music video appearances. As a dancer in Shiamak Davar's institute, Kapoor made uncredited appearances as a background dancer in the films Dil To Pagal Hai (1997) and *Taal* (1999). He also appeared in several music videos, including one for the singer Kumar Sanu, before making his acting debut with a lead role in Ken Ghosh's romantic comedy *Ishq Vishk* (2003). He followed it by playing a prospective groom in Vivah (2006) and an uptight businessman in Jab We Met (2007). In 2009, Kapoor portrayed twin brothers, one with a <u>lisp</u> and the other with a stutter, in Vishal Bhardwaj's acclaimed caper thriller *Kaminey*. After a series of commercial failures, he starred in the 2013 action-drama *R... Rajkumar*, and followed it by playing the title character in Bhardwaj's *Haider* (2014), an adaptation of William Shakespeare's tragedy *Hamlet*, which won him the Filmfare Award for Best Actor. In 2016, he played a rockstar addicted to drugs in *Udta Punjab*, for which he won the Filmfare Critics Award for

Best Actor. Kapoor has hosted eight award ceremonies, and in 2015 he featured as a talent judge on the dance reality show *Jhalak Dikhhla Jaa Reloaded*. (Full list...)
