Sample below illustrates landing position of destination page/section (red lines defining *current* landing position) in a Writer doc or exported PDF when clicking, for instance, on page number of *Table of Contents*. It would be desirable to have the option of selecting, via radio buttons or check box, the choice to either land at left of numbering Header component (i.e., corner of blue lines) or at left page margin (i.e., corner of green lines - see A).

The best default would be to rid of the current default landing position (red lines) and land position of destination page/section at *left* of numbering component of Header (as blue lines suggest) while providing the option, via check box or radio button, to land at left margin of display (as green line suggests). The left margin of display option would be needed for keeping in view -- without having to scroll horizontally -- all connected numbered Headers, Sub-headers and related text.

**NOTE: To test this, enlarge size of document (zoom in) or reduce document viewing area so scroll bars become moveable.**
