Some Carriage History

The Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway has acquired these two end-platform carriages on loan from the Rail Transport Museum (RTM) and they represent the first units of a complete passenger carrying tourist train, which we will be operating out of Oberon Station in the not too distant future.

The carriages were built in 1897, so they are now around 113 years old. They last were in service in 1977 on the Illawarra Line. They have centre isles and reversible seating and each carriage has two toilets in the centre of the car. They originally had gas lighting, but were probably converted to electricity about 1930. They were purchased by the RTM in 1977 and transferred to Thirlmere where some restoration work was carried out. In the mid 1990s they were loaned to BHP at Port Kembla where they were used for an internal site tour of the steelworks area. This continued until 2006 when Bluescope Steel took over the site. Since that time they have been stored under cover at Port Kembla, until they were transferred to OTHR. They are in remarkably good condition with only a few minor repairs and cleaning needed. Harry Cole has this well in hand.

Sheffield Trike



An historic three-wheeled "trike" was delivered to the Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway on the morning of Friday, 16th April. Known as a Sheffield Velocipede, the hand powered vehicle was generously donated by James Morrison who has over the years restored the vehicle and adapted it to the NSW standard gauge. The trike was built for the South Australian Railways - probably about 1910 - based on a design by George Sheffield of Michigan, USA.

The original design dates back to 1882, and was taken up by many railway systems around the world. These machines were in constant use by railway workers for track inspections and other fettler's tasks. Surprising as it may seem, the vehicle can attain 20km/hr on flat terrain, making track inspections relatively quick and efficient. From about 1905 onward these machines increasingly became motorised – using small two-stroke engines.

The donor, James Morrison of Thornleigh, was made an honorary member of OTHR for one year in a ceremony at Oberon Station on the day and heartily thanked for his generosity. James has also supplied OTHR with engineering scale drawings, spare parts and a CD of photos and articles on historic hand-powered rail vehicles. A most valuable resource for our organisation
