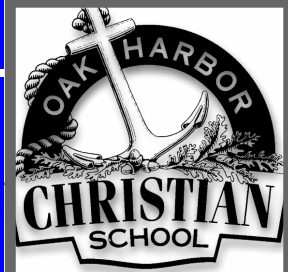

From the Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees (BOT) thanks you for your support at the informational meeting on June 1st and the special OHCS Society meeting on June 16th. The BOT has been hard at work in recent weeks, as many of you have, to help keep OHCS fully operational for the coming school year and beyond.

The BOT presented a revised budget for the 2015-16 school year that allows for a preschool through first grade offering with minimal staff. The BOT felt it was important to bring this forward to the OHCS Society since the previous Preschool-8th grade budget that was approved at April's annual meeting was unsustainable with current and projected enrollment.

We as a Society cannot overstate the importance of enrollment to rebuild our desired Kindergarten-8th grade structure. We are grateful for the recent actions to seek and talk with families to generate interest in OHCS. We appreciate, as well, our wider-community supporters that have expressed interest in scholarship-type support for tuitions.

We are encouraged to see families express interest and enroll. Community and church members have also stepped up and offered support. A lot more work needs to be done before the July 4th weekend deadline where we must retain at least 37 currently enrolled students in grades K-5 and bring in \$125,000 in donations, or the equivalent in student enrollment. If these goals can be met, the BOT would then seek to offer a Preschool through 5th grade class structure.

To our parents and supporters: there is no substitute for enrollment numbers! We continue to lift these needs to our Lord and Savior in prayer as we ask for your continued prayers and support.

Three members ending their terms of service as Trustees:

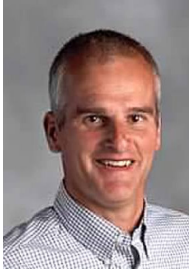
Steve Thompson, Mike Nagel and David Sherman.

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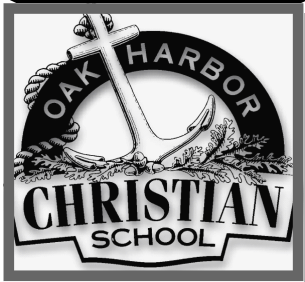
