When you create PDF files, you need to decide which PDF version to use. Generally speaking, you should use the most recent version unless there's a specific need for backward compatibility, because the latest version will include all the latest features and functionality.

However, if you're creating documents that will be distributed widely, consider choosing Acrobat 4.0 (PDF 1.3) or Acrobat 5.0 (PDF 1.4) to ensure that all users can view and print the document. If you create files with Acrobat 5.0 compatibility or later, they may not be compatible with earlier versions of Acrobat.
