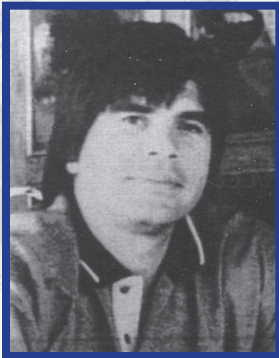

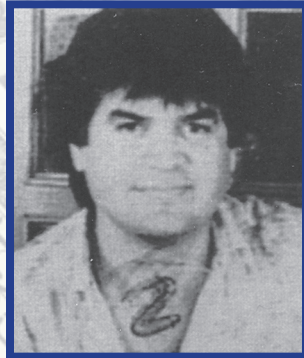

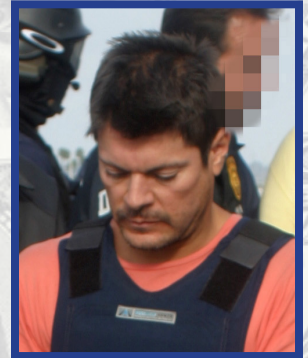

The Arellano-Felix Organization (AFO) was the most violent drug trafficking cartel in North America. Based out of Tijuana, Mexico, AFO shipped tons of cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine into the U.S. each year for over a decade. The organization was run by the Arellano-Felix family, which included brothers Benjamin, Ramon, Eduardo, Francisco Rafael and Francisco Javier.
