

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, JULY 15, 2001 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Eleven new large fires were reported in Eastern Great Basin and Northwest Areas. Four large fires were reported contained, two each in Eastern Great Basin and Northwest Areas. Initial attack activity was heavy in the Northwest and Eastern Great Basin Areas, moderate in California, Northern Rockies and Southwest Areas. Light activity was reported elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Idaho, Minnesota, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas and Wyoming.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BALD PETER, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Jackson) is assigned. This fire is burning in thick stands of beetle killed lodgepole pine 12 miles northwest of Camp Sherman, OR. Active fire behavior was observed. Extremely steep, timbered terrain is hampering containment efforts.

THIRTY MILE #103, Okanogan National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Stutler) is assigned. This human-caused fire is burning in logging slash and continuous stands of timber 20 miles north of Winthrop, WA. Creeping and backing, with some torching in the interior was observed. Fireline construction and improvement on the north, east and south flanks continues.

GRASS VALLEY COMPLEX, Prineville District, BLM. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Solarz) is assigned. This complex of fires consisting of Wagner Mountain and Ferry Canyon, is 15 miles southeast of The Dalles, OR. The fire exhibited upslope runs, with torching in junipers.

DOG CREEK, Wenatchee National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This fire is 11 miles southwest of Clifdell, WA. The fire is burning deep in the William O. Douglas Wilderness, Wenatchee National Forest.

PORCUPINE BAY, Northeast Washington State. A Washington Interagency Incident Management Team (Ariss/Graue) is assigned. This fire is 30 miles northeast of Spokane, WA. Winds have hampered containment efforts.

LIBBY SOUTH, Northeast Washington State. A Washington Interagency Incident Management Team (Ariss/Gormley) is assigned. This human caused fire is 15 miles south of Twisp, WA. Fireline construction and lining unburned pockets within the perimeter remain a priority. Mopup is proceeding as safety allows.

ROCK CREEK, Prineville District, BLM. This fire is comprised of two fires, one on each side of the John Day River, and is burning in grass, sagebrush, and juniper 14 miles east of Wasco, OR. Monitoring of the perimeter continues.

STARVATION RIDGE, Prineville District, BLM. This fire is five miles west of Olex, OR. Engines continue to monitor and patrol containment lines.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FORT RANCH, Northwest State, Utah State. This fire is north of Promontory Mountain, UT. Shifting winds resulted in fire spread in all directions. The fire is threatening area ranches, power lines and the Golden Spike Monument.

COW CANYON, Upper Snake River District, Eastern Idaho Area, BLM. This fire is burning in grass and sagebrush 11 miles west of Holbrook, ID. Critical sage grouse habitat is threatened. Shifting winds are hampering containment efforts.

MAIN HEGLAR, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. This fire is near Burley, ID. No further information was reported.

MAGNUM, Salt Lake Field Office, BLM. This fire is 11 miles north of Delle, UT. The fire made significant runs to the north and east, threatening a magnesium plant.

LITTLE FIELD, Salt Lake Field Office, BLM. This fire is ten miles southwest of Snowville, UT. The fire made extreme and significant runs in all directions. Good progress was made in containment efforts.

THIOKOL, Northwest State, Utah State. This fire is burning in light flashy fuels east of Thiokol, UT. Lack of road access and shifting winds are impeding containment efforts.

JONES HOLOW, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. The fire received some precipitation.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

HORSE CANYON, Las Cruces Field Office, BLM. This lightning caused fire is 8 miles west of Hatch, NM. Strong winds caused the fire to cross the north perimeter and make several runs during the night. Crews made some progress with burnout operations.

PINE, Prescott National Forest. This fire is in the Pine Mountain Wilderness, 18 miles southeast of Camp Verde, AZ. No new information was received.

PORCUPINE, Gila National Forest. This lightning caused Wildland Fire Use fire, which began on 7/10, is 4 miles southeast of Snow Lake, NM. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

ONIONKEYBY, Everglades National Park. This lightning caused Wildland Fire Use fire, which began on 6/25, is on the gulf coast side of the park, west of Everglades National Park Headquarters. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN REPORTED IN WESTERN AND CENTRAL UTAH FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY ***

An upper level trough over the Pacific Northwest with a strong dry southwest flow over the Great Basin will bring widely scattered thunderstorms over the area with some dry thunderstorms in Utah. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the mountains and mostly 80 to 90 elsewhere. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 30 percent, except for 5 to 15 percent in western and central Utah. Winds will be south to southwest gusting up to 40 to 50 mph over western and central Utah. Elsewhere winds will be south to west at 10 to 20 mph.

An upper level trough is intensifying over the Pacific Northwest with cooler and damper marine air filtering into the area. This will bring mostly cloudy skies west of the Cascades and partly cloudy north to sunny south on the east side. Showers and light rain will develop over western Washington. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's in western Washington and northwest Oregon, 70's to lower 80's in interior Oregon and east of the Cascades. Minimum relative humidity will range above 50 percent in western Washington and northwest Oregon, otherwise it will be 18 to 28 percent. Wind will be breezy east of the Cascades with gusts up to 30 mph in some areas.
