BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS DECEMBER, 2005 - FEBRUARY, 2006

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period December, 2004 - February, 2005. I've compiled observations for species which are listed as **Sporadic, Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical** or **Not included** (?) on the park's checklist. A "?win" indicates a species which is documented for the park but not in the winter season.

The winter season in Big Bend was generally mild and very dry, with less than an inch of precipitation falling anywhere in the park over the three month period. The last measurable rainfall occurred at the end of January and the dry spell continues at this writing. Cold fronts were few and for the most part did not last more than a few days. A comparison of current precipitation totals through February with the same period last year (+ or -) illustrates the recovery from the early winter dry spell: Panther Junction; 0.56" (-0.95"), Chisos Basin; 0.78" (-0.78"), Rio Grande Village; 0.58" (-0.28"), Castolon; 0.30" (-1.21"), and Persimmon Gap; 0.44" (-1.12").

The annual Christmas Counts (December 28-29) tallied good species totals but far lower individual counts than expected. Food crop conditions were generally poor, and unlike the previous year, sporadically occurring species were low or altogether absent (ash-throated flycatcher, house wren, American robin, sage thrashers, and sage sparrow).

The only review species documented during the period was **Varied Thrush**, with one male reported first on January 17 in the Boot Canyon, and a subsequent observation of two males in the same area on February 2 (photos by Carpenter). The last observation reported was on February 17. The reports here are in line with several other west Texas observations from the Davis and Guadalupe Mountains (Pers. Comm. - Lockwood). Varied thrush was last documented in the park in January 1982.

A female rufous hummingbird found nearly frozen, but still alive, on December 1 during one of the few cold fronts to push through the area was a distressing find. Fortunately the bird was revived and apparently survived to flee the area when warmer temperatures returned the next day. Other winter highlights include white-tailed kite, red-shouldered hawk, short-eared owl, white-eyed vireo, black-throated gray warbler, and a lone male purple finch.

Greater yellowlegs and ovenbird reports represent first winter records for the park. Finally, Eurasian collared doves (at least two) were present during the period at Rio Grande Village. Though this exotic has yet to establish a permanent presence in the park, there is a small, but thriving, population just outside the west boundary in Study Butte and Terlingua Springs. Given the presence of a pair at Rio Grande Village, a breeding population in the park is likely only a matter of short time.

BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS MARCH - MAY 2006

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period March 1 - May 31. I've compiled only those observations for species which are listed as Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical or Not included (?) on the park's checklist. A "?spr" indicates a species which is documented for the park but not in the spring season.

Drought conditions prevailed throughout West Texas during the spring season with very high temperatures beginning in late March. March was extremely dry, with not one recording station receiving more than 0.15 inches. April improved only slightly, with Panther junction receiving just over an inch. May brought a couple of good days with rain measuring from a quarter to nearly one inch. Precipitation totals year-to-date as compared to the same time period last year (+ or -) is as follows: Panther Junction; 2.17 " (-0.65"), Chisos Basin; 1.91" (-1.06"), Rio Grande Village; 0.70" (-1.55"), Castolon; 0.18" (-2.16"), and Persimmon Gap; 0.68" (-2.14").

The lack of rain during the spring resulted in a late-arriving migration front, but once it stared moving, a good variety of species were reported. A fire early in the season in the Chisos Basin (March 9) had little impact on migrants, but two fires in Mexico's Sierra del Carmen range (one in early May, a second about two weeks later) may have created a flurry of late and unexpected species. Indeed, a total of seven review species were reported this spring, six of which could potentially be the fall-out from the combination of fires and drought in the mountains south of our border.

A pair of ruddy ground-doves were reported from Boquillas Canyon trail on May 31 (report pending from Seniawski), observed in the giant cane thickets next to the river. A report of a greater pewee in the high Chisos in early May was frustrating because no documentation was submitted by an otherwise experienced birder. In late May, a party of four experienced observers reported hearing two calling dusky-capped flycatchers in the high Chisos, but was unable to make any audio recordings. A documented report of a red-faced warbler on the lower Laguna Meadow Trail in late April was a good find, followed by an unusual report of the same species in the park service residence area at Panther Junction on May 16, right about the time of the second fire in the del Carmens. Perhaps the bird of the season was a beautifully photographed slatethroated redstart in Boot Canyon on May 2. As is typical with this species in Big Bend, it appears to have been a one-day wonder, in spite of the efforts of many experienced birders to relocate the bird. Finally, two Baird's sparrows were reported in the grassy fields around the Daniels Ranch picnic area at Rio Grande Village in early May, one report including excellent photographs.

The one review species that didn't have southerly connections was a late **varied thrush** photographed in atypical habitat in Cottonwood Campground on March 14. This lone male was likely a lingering individual from the minor invasion of varied thrushes this past winter.

Two species were added to the main park checklist this spring, one on the basis of a fortuitous meeting at Panther Junction in late April. In conversation about (what else) birds, Peter MacGregor revealed that he had photographs of a brown pelican observed in May, 2005 at Hot Springs. The digital images he sent, crystal clear shots of an immature brown pelican, elevate that species from the park's hypothetical list to the main list. The second addition to the list was a species not previously reported in the park.

On March 1, a first winter plumage Bonaparte's gull at Santa Elena Canyon was photo-documented, providing a first park record. The addition of these two species brings the main list to 407, with an additional 43 species still on the hypothetical list (and waiting for confirmation).

Other highlights for the spring: Blue-throated hummingbirds and hepatic tanagers occurring at lower than normal elevation, most likely in response to extremely dry conditions in their normal haunts. A lone least grebe that stayed faithful to the settling pond at Daniels Ranch for a week while the pond was used for irrigation. Colima warblers and painted redstarts were abundant and vocal in Boot Canyon, making for many satisfied birders. Late and unusual observations of hooded and Canada warblers were interesting reports and probably the result of fires on the east slopes of the del Carmens. A lone Couch's kingbird calling at Cottonwood campground in proximity to a calling tropical kingbird was an excellent exercise in ear-birding in late May. Finally, on a somewhat sour note, Eurasian collared doves were observed all over the park, and appear to have established breeding populations at Rio Grande Village. It was only a matter of time....

BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS JUNE - JULY 2006

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period June 1 - July 31. I've compiled only those observations for species that are listed as Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical or Not included (?) on the park's checklist. A "?sum" indicates a species which is documented for the park but not in the summer season.

Hot and dry are the best terms to describe the Big Bend region's summer season. June and July were both extreme, continuing the trend from the spring season. It wasn't until the evening of July $27^{\rm th}$ that one storm dropped nearly a third of the year to date total precipitation (Interestingly, I lifted this sentence from last summer's report; same date, almost identical rainfall). Since that event, the summer monsoonal pattern has arrived and the region has received abundant precipitation, boding well for the coming fall. Year to date precipitation as compared to ytd totals through July 2005 + or -) is as follows: Panther Junction; 3.10" (-4.17"), Chisos Basin; 3.93" (-2.01"), Rio Grande Village; 1.22" (-2.71"), Castolon; 4.24" (-2.39"). Persimmon Gap; 2.21" (-2.17").

Two review species were reported during the period. A white-eared hummingbird female was reported along the Colima Trail in late June, and a male flame-colored tanager was reported from the Juniper Flat area on July 2. Both reports have been submitted to the Texas Bird Records Committee and are awaiting review.

The common black-hawk pair at Rio Grande Village staged an interesting sleight of hand (wing?) in mid-June. For a period of a week, the pair was observed on the ground below the nest, paying close attention to ...something. In the summer of 2000, similar behavior led to the discovery of a nestling that had fallen out of the nest after a wind storm. That nestling was returned to the nest by park staff, but subsequently disappeared. Suspecting that the same thing had occurred, I conducted a search of the grassy field below the nest, all the while ducking the dives of an irate adult. Unable to find anything, I retreated. A week later, Kym Beckwith found a juvenile black-hawk perched in a mesquite, attended by an adult. The youngster stayed faithful to the mesquite for several days, stretching wings and legs, but never attempting flight. Finally, a week later, Beckwith again found the juvenile, this time back in the nest, and attended by both adults. There have been no further observations of the juvenile, but I assume it has successfully fledged from the nest.

Other highlights include a very out of place neotropic cormorant perched on a power line in Terlingua, a rather mysterious appearance given there were no major weather events at the time, an also out of season long-billed curlew at Hot Springs, and several early migrant warblers (black-throated gray and Louisiana waterthrush) in the Boot Canyon area of the Chisos Mountains.

Finally, Researcher Jeff Troy conducted the annual black-capped vireo survey in the park, locating a total of 23-25 adult birds (17-18 males, 6-7 females), and two hatch-year birds on one nest.

Fall Season: General Weather Patterns

The summer monsoonal pattern that entered in late July really gained momentum in the month of August, bringing abundant rain and moderating the high temperatures of early summer. Indeed, fifty percent or more of the year-to-date precipitation indicated below fell in August alone, making for an excellent recovery in what had appeared to be another drought year. The abundant rainfall, coupled with sustained releases from reservoirs along the Rio Conchos in Mexico, brought the Rio Grande up to excellent levels for rafting. Even with reduced rainfall in September, the river remained high through the month and on into October. Several periods of good rain around mid-October kept the river up and the desert green. November was delightful in terms of mild temperatures, but was completely dry for the entire month. It wasn't until the close of November that the first cold front passed through the region, dropping nighttime temperatures into the twenty degree range.

A comparison of current year to date precipitation with year-to-date totals through November 2005 (+ or -) documents the region's recovery from the brink of drought.

Fall Season: The Birds

August, with all its abundant rainfall, was uncharacteristically slow for birds, but not entirely without some highlights. An interesting report was submitted mid-August for hairy woodpecker, a hypothetically occurring species in the park. The closest area in Texas where this species occurs with any regularity is in the Guadalupe Mountains, but apparently there is a breeding population much closer to home in the Maderas del Carmen mountains just across the border in Mexico.

Another interesting aspect of this past August does not involve a reported species, but rather its absence; the last fall season without a red-faced warbler report was 1998. There was one accepted record from the 2006 spring season, just prior to the June decision of the Texas Bird Records Committee (TBRC) to remove red-faced warbler from the review species list. I draw no conclusions as to the connection between the species' no-show in August and its delisting by the TBRC....

Three other rare species, whose standing on the review list is firm, were reported during the season; a **greater pewee** at Cottonwood Campground from 9/30 to 10/06, a **black-vented oriole** at the Rio Grande Village nature trail on 10/06, and a **varied thrush** on 11/30 along the Pinnacles Trail. The pewee was well documented with photos (Leavitt) and written details. The last accepted record of this species in Big Bend NP was August, 1991 in the Boot Canyon area. The oriole was a one-day wonder, unlike the last documented record in Big Bend NP, when Ro Wauer reported an adult in Rio Grande Village in September 1968, again from April to September 1969, then again from April to October 1970. The thrush too, was an apparent one-day wonder and echoes the

2005/2006 winter season when at least two males were present in the Boot Canyon area.

Other highlights for the season include several late dates: a male blue-throated hummingbird on the northeast rim on 11/05, a female or immature Rufous/Allen's hummingbird on 11/05, a male black-capped vireo in the high Chisos on 10/29, a male black-throated gray warbler on 11/09 in RGV, and finally a male pine warbler on 11/27, also in RGV.
