## Welcome Spring!

We're doing a lot of planning for spring and summer at LLF! Mark your calendars for the following events. More information for all events will be given to parents closer to the dates listed.

## April 4-8: Week of the Young Child

This is a week of celebration of children. The theme this year is "Children's Opportunities are our Responsibilities". We are planning to give the children a lot of opportunities this week in addition to the opportunities they get each day at LLF. Several events to watch for include a parent's breakfast with your child, car seat inspections in our parking lot, free literature on parenting topics, and days when parents and grandparents are invited to play and read to the children. Also, we plan to have face painting for the children on Friday of that week. #### June 13: Summer Camp begins



# **KIDS ART CORNER- Baby Jar Garden**

## What You Need

- Baby food jar with lid
- Small dried or silk flowers
- Rolling pin
- Craft or hot glue
- Homemade (or store bought) play dough

## Play dough recipe:



- 1 cup Flour
- 2 teaspoons Cream of tartar
- 1/4 cup Salt
- 1 cup warm Water
- 1 teaspoon Oil
- Food coloring

## How To Make It

- 1. **Play dough** Mix all ingredients, adding food coloring last. Stir over medium heat until blended smooth. Place in plastic bag or airtight container when cooled.
- 2. **Making the 'garden'** Roll out play dough with a rolling pin. Use the mouth of the jar as a cookie cutter (if you use the lid, you can't close the jar). Hot glue (adults only) the play dough into the lid and wait about 10 seconds. Have the kids stick flowers into the dough. Leave lids on a cookie sheet to dry over night.
- 3. When the play dough is dry, screw on the lid carefully.

You can write a name on the jar with glitter or decorate any way you wan
