H.R. 4284

A bill to authorize the government of India to establish a memorial to honor Mahatma Gandhi in the District of Columbia

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on July 22, 1998

CBO estimates that enacting H.R. 4284 would have no impact on the federal budget. The bill would not affect direct spending or receipts; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply. H.R. 4284 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.

H.R. 4284 would authorize the government of India to establish a memorial honoring Mahatma Gandhi on federal land in Washington, D.C. The bill would allow the Department of the Interior or another federal agency to execute a cooperative agreement with India under which that country would maintain the memorial. No federal funds could be used for that purpose.
