

Cupertino. **LE PETIT TRIANON**, De Anza College campus, 1892. Frame, stuccoed; 1 story, rectangular, flat roof with parapet, full-across width front colonnade with slight center segmental bow, French windows, Ionic columns along side walls with round arched windows; moved. Neo-Classical Revival. Mansion built on wine-producing estate; later bought by Pullman heiress, Harriet Pullman Carolan, who entertained lavishly here. Design and name derived from Le Petit Trianon at Versailles (1762-1768). *Public/private.*
