PHONE KEYS

- **Contrast** key cycles through eight settings to adjust the display contrast.
- **Directory** key allows you to store and access up to 50 numbers and names.
- Save key stores numbers and names in the *Directory* and in memory keys.
- Up Arrow and Down Arrow keys allow you to move up and down any list such as the Set Options, Directory, Callers List, or Redial List.
- Left Arrow key allows you to backspace and erase when predialing and when adding or changing numbers and names in the Directory, Callers List, or in memory keys.
- **Right Arrow** key adds a space when entering names in the *Directory* or in memory keys. It allows you to view status messages on the display.
- Hold key puts the call on hold, inserts a pause, and shifts between upper and lower case.
- Ris key always hangs up a call. It also allows you to leave any list such as the Set Options List, Callers List, Redial List, or Directory.
- **Callers** key allows you to access a list of people who called.
- Delete key allows you to erase memory keys, delete a single item or all items in the Directory and Callers List, and deletes the entire Redial List.
- Link key allows you to transfer calls and to access network features such as Call Waiting.
- Redial key allows you access to a list of the last five numbers dialed.
- **Dial** key dials any displayed number and activates handsfree mode if you have not lifted the handset.
- Handsfree Mute key activates the handsfree speaker and microphone so you can listen and talk without lifting the handset. It also allows you to mute a handsfree call so that a caller cannot hear you.
- Memory keys store numbers, names, and features.
- The Set Options key is hidden under the ODIN sliding panel and allows you to access 10 options to customize . the telephone.

SET OPTIONS

The **Set Options** key is accessed by sliding the **ODIN** panel to the right. There are 10 options available to you. Use the Down Arrow and Up Arrow keys to view the list of options, or use the dial pad to enter the option number. When an option is changed, the message - confirmed - will be displayed. To exit Set Options, press the RIs key.

Option 02, Set Time/Date

The time and date will be set automatically after your first incoming call. However, if the power goes off, you may have to reset the time and date.

- To set the time and date, press the Set Options key. Press the Up Arrow and Down Arrow keys to Step 1. scroll to number 2, or press 02 on the dial pad.
- Press the * key and follow the directions on the display. Step 2.

Option 03, Set Ring Tone

- Before setting the ring tone, make sure the ringer is turned on. Press the Set Options key. Use the Up Step 1. Arrow and Down Arrow keys to scroll to number 3, or press 03 on the dial pad to go directly to the item.
- Press * on the dial pad. When picking the ring tone, press the **Volume** bar to adjust the volume. Step 2.
- To listen to the next ring tone, press the **Down Arrow** key. Step 3.
- Step 4. Press Save key when you are satisfied with the ring tone and ringer volume. NOTE: You cannot turn the volume off when you are choosing the ring tone.

Option 06, Clear Message Waiting

Sometimes your *Message Waiting* light will continue to flash after you have cleared all your voicemail messages.

- Step 1. To clear the message waiting light, press the Set Options key. Press the Down Arrow or Up Arrow keys to scroll to number 6, or press 06 on the dial pad.
- Step 2. Press the * key to clear it.

RETRIEVING MESSAGES

To access your voicemail from your primary phone, dial 7-8740. To access your voicemail from a phone other than your primary phone, dial (321) 867-8740, enter your mailbox number (5 digit phone number) followed by the |*|key, and enter your passcode.

- Press **P** (the 7 key) to play the message. After listening to your message,
 - Press **K** (the 5 key) to keep the message.
 - Press G (the 4 key) to give it to someone. •
 - Press P (the 7 key) to play it again. •

• Press **D** (the 3 key) to discard the message. RELEASED - Printed documents may be obsolete; validate prior to use.

- Press **U** (the 8 key) to select <u>user options</u>.
 - Press **G** (the 4 key) to access your greeting.
 - Press L (the 5 key) to <u>listen</u> to your current greeting.
 - Press **R** (the 7 key) to <u>record</u> your greeting.
 - Press **X** (the 9 key) to <u>exit</u> the greeting option.
 - Press N (the 6 key) to access your <u>name</u>
 - Press L (the 5 key) to listen to your name.
 - Press **R** (the 7 key) to record your name.
 - Press X (the 9 key) to exit the name option.
 - Press **P** (the 7 key) to access your <u>passcode</u>. You will be prompted to enter a four to ten digit number, or if you do not want a passcode, enter four zeros.
 - Press L (the 5 key) to access a <u>distribution list</u>. You will be prompted to enter a distribution list number.
 - Press X (the 9 key) to exit the user options.
- Press M (the 6 key) to make a new message. You will be prompted to enter the mailbox to make the message for.

ADJUSTING CONTRAST ON THE DISPLAY

To adjust the contrast on the display, press the **Contrast** key. There are eight contrast levels. Press the **Contrast** key to select the level, or press and hold the **Contrast** key until the desired level is displayed.

VOLUME CONTROL

Turning the Ringer On or Off

NOTE: Do not lift the handset while turning the ringer on or off.

- **Step 1.** Press the right side of the **Volume** bar. Continue pressing the right side until you reach the desired ring volume.
- **Step 2.** Press the left side of the **Volume** bar. Continue pressing the left side until the ringer is off. Ringer is OFF appears on the display.

Controlling the Ringer Volume

When the telephone is ringing, press the left or right side of the **Volume** bar to adjust the ringer volume.

Controlling the Receiver Volume

When you are on the telephone, press the left or right side of the **Volume** bar to adjust the receiver volume. When you have completed your call, the receiver volume returns to default.

MAKING AND HANDLING PHONE CALLS

Making a Regular Call

Lift the handset or press Handsfree Mute key. Enter the number using the dial pad.

Making a Predialed Call

Enter the number using the dial pad. Lift the handset or press either Handsfree Mute key or Dial key.

Answering a Call

Lift the handset or press Handsfree Mute key.

Placing a Call on Hold and Taking a Call Off Hold

- Step 1. Make or answer a call.
- **Step 2.** Press **Hold** key. The display shows that the call is on hold.
- **Step 3.** Hang up the handset. NOTE: If you don't hang up the handset and the call is picked up by someone at another extension, the call is taken off hold but remains connected to your telephone. Any background noise from your area will be heard by the caller and the person at the other extension.
- **Step 4.** To retrieve the call, lift the handset or press either **Hold** key or **Handsfree Mute** key. If you don't retrieve the call within 15 minutes, the call is automatically dropped.

TRANSFERRING A CALL

- **Step 1.** To transfer a call to another phone number, press the **Link** key.
- Step 2. Listen for the dial tone.
- **Step 3.** If you want to transfer the call without speaking to the person you are transferring the call to, enter the number you are transferring the call to, and when the phone rings, hang up the handset.
- **Step 4.** If you want to speak with the person you are transferring the call to before you transfer the call, enter the number you are transferring the call to, speak with the person, press the **Link** key, and hang up the handset.

3-WAY CONFERENCE CALL

- Step 1. With one caller on the line (a call you received or one you placed), press the Link key.
- **Step 2.** Listen for the dial tone.
- Step 3. Enter the phone number for the third person, press the Link key, and stay on the line.
