

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCES, 2101 Constitution Ave., NW., 1922-1924, Bertram Grosvenor Goodhue, architect. Steel frame, concrete, marble exterior; rectangular main block attached to modified Greek cross shaped Great Hall, walls slightly battered, center entrance with false pediment with sculpture, recessed windows, grille-covered openings in entablature and on ground floor; relief work, sculpture, and lighting fixtures by Lee Lawrie; 1960's-1970's additions, interior galleries and office space. Art Deco and Neo-Classical Revival elements. Built as headquarters for the National Academy of Sciences, inc. 1863. *Private*.
