1. San Francisco City Tour and Lunch

Your guide will regale you with tales of the Earthquake and Fire of 1906 and our more recent earthquake of 1989, as you view fine examples of Victorian survivors now fondly referred to as "The Painted Ladies".

Feel the business pulse as you see the Financial District, the "Wall Street of the West"; drive through the Civic Center, an architectural delight, including Davies Symphony Hall and the Opera House.

The tour will conclude with lunch at Fisherman's Wharf.

2. Muir Woods & Sausalito Tour

The ride to Muir Woods will take us over the Golden Gate Bridge through part of Mill Valley, up Mt. Tamalpais and down into the cool green 500 acre Sequoia semperviren grove, named for the naturalist, John Muir. At carefully selected wineries, guides will await to lead you through the processes of wine-making. A tasting of wines will follow.

On the other side of the mountain in Sonoma the visitor can relive early California history...seeing the historic Town Square, its Spanish Mission and adobe ruins.

A no host lunch will be enjoyed at the Town Square in Sonoma. It is surrounded by all types of delicatessens and restaurants offering something for every taste.

After Lunch we will tour and taste at a unique Sonoma winery before returning to San Francisco via Golden Gate Bridge.

We will peek in on a fortune cookie factory in production and leave with some samples to nibble on while we stroll. We'll visit a temple where the smell of incense greets you as you enter. Oranges and oils are stacked ready for offering to deities. We can also include a visit to tea emporium where you will be treated to a tea ceremony.

This unique experience concludes with a Dim Sum lunch. After lunch, there will be time for shopping.

Including: Vertigo, Dirty Harry, Foul Play, Star Trek IV-The Voyage Home, Pal Joey, The Maltese Falcon, Birdman of Alcatraz, It Came From Beneath The Sea, Nine Months, The Bachelor, The Graduate, Mrs. Doubtfire, American Graffiti, The Rock and Harold & Maude. Clips include scenes from films as they relate to San Francisco, with some of the greatest actors of all time.

About our guide: Craig Smith, a Bay Area native, has spent years studying films made in the San Francisco Bay Area. He has lived in "The City" since 1964 and has a BA and teaching credential from UC Santa Cruz. He taught sculpture at the University. Craig also studied film making at Los Angeles Art Center. 6. Carmel & Monterey

Early Spanish explorers, while searching for the Golden Gate, settled a sleepy fishing village, Monterey. Monterey now offers restored adobes and Colonial architecture, a Fisherman's Wharf and Cannery Row, made famous by John Steinbeck's novel.

The \$80 million Monterey Bay Aquarium, built 1984, is the largest indoor aquarium in the nation featuring a stunning "undersea" tour. You will have a chance to visit the Aquarium (additional cost) or have free time at the Cannery Row. After the stop in Monterey we will continue on to Carmel to shop and browse in the art galleries.

We will follow the private 17-Mile Drive along the coast, past twisted Monterey Cypress and the "Lone Pine". By the crashing surf, see the world famous Pebble Beach golf course. The area is also home to the opulent Spanish or Mediterranean style Del Monte Properties.

Carmel, a unique community in California, with its geranium filled window boxes and quaint little shops, is the no host luncheon destination. After viewing the Carmel Mission, we will begin our scenic return to San Francisco.

7. Alcatraz

Cruise to the infamous former federal prison – home to the likes of Al Capone, "Machine Gun" Kelly and Robert "the Birdman" Stroud. "The Rock," now administered by the National Park Service, is just a mile and a quarter from the sights and sounds of one of the world's most beautiful cities, San Francisco. It has been used as a fort, a lighthouse, and a prison. Explore the awesome 12-acre prison and grounds, including the cell-blocks where the convicts were imprisoned. A Park Service Guide will greet you before you begin the self-guided tour with an audio-cassette.

8. San Francisco's Painted Ladies

Victorian homes reflect the rich heritage that makes San Francisco unique among America's cities. It's instant wealth, starting with the Gold Rush, continued to set living patterns through the years. The City now boasts a number of beautifully preserved private Victorian Houses. After a drive to Alamo Square to view the "Painted Ladies", a stop may be made at the **Reutlinger Home**. A visitor will be fascinated by the collection of Victorians as well as the collection of player pianos that will get everyone's toes tapping.

Other private homes available:

Haas-Lilienthal House, the grande dame of San Francisco's Victorians, is a real treat for those who wish to experience the life style of prosperous turn-of-the-century families. Original furnishings are still in the home.

Shannon-Kavanaugh House, built in 1892, has become one of the most famous buildings in America. After 17 years of meticulous restoration, the house remains the anchor of "Postcard Row" in San Francisco's Alamo Square historic district.

Octagon House is a local heirloom, a perfectly preserved, uniquely shaped building dating to 1861, now used as a small but superb museum of the decorative arts of the Colonial and Federal periods.

Westerfeld House: 28-room home, circa 1882. This home has often been used as a symbol for Victorian San Francisco due to its fanciful tower, emphatic bay windows, and prominent hilltop location facing Alamo Square Park.
