

# Schizachyrium scoparium

## Little Bluestem



A wonderful grass -- very tough, adaptable and beautiful. Great for dry sites, with good drought tolerance. Forms clumps of thin, blue-green, or sometimes purplish foliage, and turns a brilliant coppery-red in the fall. Seedheads are fluffy and white. Easy to find commercially; there are several forms selected for their outstanding color. Formerly called *Andropogon scoparius*.

**Suggested companions:** Other prairie grasses and prairie flowers such as butterfly weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*), black-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*), goldenrods (*Solidago* sp), and wild bergamot (*Monarda fistulosa*).
