I. Whether a novice or experienced gardener, the challenge for a present-day gardener is to be a naturalist with a "waste not, want not" ecological commitment: a caretaker of the environmental community.

The ecowise gardener: location, location, location

- Nature's hitch-hiker: As a gardener, why should you be environmentally aware? Through developing a partnership with season, an ecowise gardener receives abundant reward with minimal effort.
- The soil wise gardener: For a novice gardener, gardening is all about plants but for an ecowise gardener, it's all about soil.

- Landscaping gardening, more than gardening: To an ecowise gardener, landscaping is the global perspective of a site's location and its surroundings; in other words, one or more gardens, lawns, patios, decks, trees, shrubs, fences/hedges, foundation plantings, driveways, and walkways.
- Getting started: Developing a landscape is more than an ecowise plan. It must consider the influence of personal preference and community restrictions.
- Developing a master plan, tips and strategies: Whether developing a formal or informal plan, there are tips and strategies that aide the mechanics of plan design.
- The match game: After identifying the effect of existing or proposed hardscape, the issue becomes choosing a style of design.
- Trees and shrubs, the bones of a design: While trees and shrubs are used to establishing focal points, delineated sections, and transition between the areas, strategically placed they equally provide energy efficiency.
- A garden room, an element of the overall design: Delineated sections of a design are presently referred to as garden rooms.
- Limit texture and contrast: Too many focal points distract from the natural pleasure of nature, itself.
- Create transition: Transition is the make or break design element. It enables a visual tour without interruption.
