On January 3, 2001, the above-captioned plaintiffs in the filed a complaint seeking a temporary restraining order, preliminary injunction, permanent injunction, and declaratory relief. The plaintiffs are Virgin Islands residents who operate Polak v. Rutnik Civ. No. 01-01 Order Page 2

as itinerant vendors in the parking area opposite the Drake Seat site. In this action, they allege that the defendants conspired to wrongfully evict the plaintiffs from the Drake Seat site in violation of the plaintiffs' constitutional rights as protected by the First and Fourteenth Amendments.

In light of the existing preliminary injunction entered in Civil No. 1985-280 on September 17, 1985, *nunc pro tunc* to July 25, 1985, "barring the Department of Conservation and Cultural Affairs from denying the plaintiffs the right to conduct their businesses at the location across from the Drake Seat site pursuant to valid permits issued to them by the Department of Public Safety" (*see* Order Granting Prelim. Injunct. at 3), it is hereby

ORDERED that the motion for a temporary restraining order is **DENIED** as moot. It is further

ORDERED that the requirements of LRCi 7.1, which requires that a motion, opposition, and reply be filed with the Court at the same time, are waived. The defendants shall file with the Court and serve on the plaintiffs any responsive pleadings raising jurisdictional or other matters allowed under FED. R. CIV. P. 12 or any motions seeking to add necessary parties pursuant to FED. R. CIV. P. 19 by 12:00 noon on Wednesday, January 10, 2001. The plaintiffs shall have until 10:00 a.m. on Friday, Polak v. Rutnik Civ. No. 01-01 Order page 3 January 12, 2001 to file with the Court and serve on the defendants any reply and/or response.
