Old Blenheim Bridge

New York Route 30 over Schoharie Creek, North Blenheim

Appearing as if it belonged in a Currier and Ives print, this is one of the longest single-span wooden covered bridges in the world, stretching 210 feet across Schoharie Creek. Old Blenheim Bridge was constructed in 1855 by Vermonter Nicholas Montgomery Powers, who received \$6,000 for his work. The bridge was in use until 1932, when a new span was built downstream alongside it.
