

Judge Tim A. Baker receives Presidential Citation from Indiana State Bar Association

Magistrate Judge Tim A. Baker was recently honored with a Presidential Citation from the Indiana State Bar Association. Outgoing President Richard S. Eynon presented the award in recognition of Judge Baker's exceptional contributions to the profession of law and the residents of Indiana.

Judge Baker serves as the chair of the ISBA Federal Judiciary Committee and has been instrumental in organizing the "Relationships Between Congress and the Federal Courts" conference. Judge Baker has also recently been appointed to the ISBA Board of Governors, and has held various other leadership positions with the organization.

Judge Baker was appointed U.S. Magistrate Judge for the Southern District of Indiana in 2001. From 1995 until his appointment to the bench, he served as an Assistant United States Attorney. Judge Baker also has experience in private practice, working from 1991 until 1995 at Barnes & Thornburg in Indianapolis. He also clerked for U.S. District Judge Larry J. McKinney from 1989-1991. Judge Baker is a 1989 graduate of the Valparaiso University School of Law. He received his bachelor's degree in journalism from Indiana University in 1984.
