
Label this map of Fort George Island! Use the names from the word bank. You can ask a ranger or volunteer for help.

The Exchange of Cultures – Do You Speak Timucua?




Father Pareja ("Pah-RAY-ha") was a Spanish missionary. He wrote down how to speak the Timucua language so he could teach them to be Christians.




RC What else lives on Fort George Island?





#2: P O G E H R SEITROTO


