Techie Corner

Is your Polycom ViaVideo slowing down your system? For those ViaVideo users utilizing dual monitors, please note that placing the ViaVideo window on the second monitor will impact your system dramatically (i.e., unresponsive menu selections, freezing, etc.) **Solution**: Keep the ViaVideo window on your "main" monitor screen.
