Endangered Species of Georgia Georgia Ecological Services

Georgia provides habitat for 63 species of plants and animals on the Federal Endangered and Threatened Species List. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Marine Fisheries Service work with the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, as well as universities, conservation groups, and private landowners, to protect habitat for these species and promote species recovery. These species, as well as numerous other species at risk, are considered threatened or endangered by the State of Georgia.
