



Flagg Information Station

Flagg Information Station is part of the John D. Rockefeller Memorial Parkway. The station is open 8 am - 5 pm daily from December 21, 2005 until March 12, 2006. The Parkway, nearly 24,000 acres, connects Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks. The Parkway was named to honor John D. Rockefeller's commitment to the preservation of the Jackson Hole and his significant contributions to the National Park Service. John D. Rockefeller Memorial Parkway offers outstanding year-round recreational opportunities. Check with a ranger at the station for more information.

In case of emergency dial 911 from the pay phone on the porch of the information station.

Yellowstone National Park

- This is the closest point to Yellowstone National Park open to autos in winter. The winter road closure begins here. Automobiles may not travel beyond this point. The South Entrance to Yellowstone is 2 miles north.
- In winter Yellowstone is accessible only by snowmobile, snowcoach, or cross country skiing. Yellowstone is open only to guided snowmobile or snowcoach tours. Contact an outfitter for further details. A list of outfitters is available inside the information station.

Grassy Lake Road

- Grassy Lake Road is open to snowmobiling between Flagg Ranch and Ashton, ID.
- All snowmobile trips on Grassy Lake Road beginning at Flagg Ranch must use Best Available Technology (BAT) snowmobiles. A list of BAT snowmobile models is available in the information station.


Flagg area cross country ski and snowshoe trails

Polecat Creek Loop Trail

- Easy, 2.5 miles roundtrip, elevation change 50'.
- This trail provides access to Huckleberry and Polecat Hot Springs.

Huckleberry/ Polecat Hot Springs Regulations

- No Camping. This area is now designated as day use only. Due to increased visitor use and resource impact, camping is prohibited in this area. This includes the entire area surrounding all hot springs.
- No Dogs. Pets are prohibited at all hot springs. Pets are permitted only on roads and must be on a leash at all times. The groomed Grassy Lake Road is open to pets.
- Park in the lot in front of Flagg Ranch Lodge. The lot nearest the trailhead is reserved for commercial use only.
- Please respect wildlife and observe from a safe distance.



Flagg Canyon Trail North

- Difficult, 4.0 miles RT, elevation change 120'.
- Use caution to avoid cornices where the trail follows the edge of cliffs above the Snake River.
- Return via the snowmobile trail to make a loop.
- Park in the lot in front of Flagg Ranch Lodge. The lot nearest the trailhead is reserved for commercial use only.

Flagg Canyon Trail South

- Easy, 4.0 miles RT, elevation change: 40'.
- Return via the snowmobile trail adjacent to the road to make a loop.
- Park in the lot in front of Flagg Ranch Lodge. The lot nearest the trailhead is reserved for commercial use only.
