TATEMENT HURRICANE ABBY AND TORNADO WATCH FROM ESSA WEATHER BUREAU ORLANDO FLORIDA 1230AM EDT JUNE 4 1968 TO SUPPLEMENT MIDNIGHT ADVISORY FROM MIAMI.

HURRICANE ABBY HAS WEAKENED AND DRIFTED TO THE EAST A SHORT DISTANCE DURING THE PAST THREE HOURS. 15 3DNIGHT ABBY WAS LOCATED NEAR LAT 26.0 AND LONG 83.0 OR STILL ABOUT 220 MILES SOUTHWEST OF ORLANDO. ABBY IS EXPECTED TO MOVE LITTLE DURING THE NIGHT BUT A SLOW DRIFT TO THE NNE OF AROUND 4 TO 7 MPH IS EXPECTED TUESDAY.

IT STILL APPEARS LIKELY THAT AN ISOLATED TORNADO AND OR A FEW SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS MAY OCCUR OVER CENTRAL FLORIDA UNTIL THREE AM. THE AREA OF POSSIBLE SEVERE WEATHER EXTENDS SOUTH OF ALINE FROM 50 MILES NORTH OF TAMPA TO MELBOURNE FLORIDA. THIS AREA INCLUDES EXTREME SOUTH LAKE COUNTY EXTREME SOUTHWEST OANGE AND MOST OF OSCEOLA COUNTIES. THIS AREA DOES NOT INCLUDE ORLANDO PROPER. THE PENINSULA UNTIL EARLY THIS EVENING. THIS MEANS THAT WINDS WILL NOT
PICK UP APPRECIABLY IN ORANGE LAKE SEMINOLE AND OSCEOLA COUNTIES
UNTIL TONITE AND WEDNESDAY AND SINCE ABBEY IS NOW ONLY OF

HURRICANE ABBEY LOCATED AT 6AM APPROXIMATELY 160 MILES SOUTH SOUTHWEST OF ORLANDO IS MOVING NORTHEASTWARD AT 10 MPH. SHE IS NOW APPROACHING THE COAST NEAR FORT MEYERS AND WILL LIKELY PASS OUT INTO THE ATLANTIC NEAR CAPE KENNEDY EARLY TONITE. STATEMENT STORM ABBEY AND TORNADO WATCH FROM ESSA WEATHER BUREAU
ORLANDO FLA 12.30PM EDT JUNE 4 1968 TO SUPPLEMENT THE NOON
ADVISORY FROM MIAMI.

AT NOON ABBEY WAS LOCATED AT APPROXIMATELY NINETY MILES SOUTH
SOUTHWEST OF ORLANDO MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHEAST AT NINE MILES
PER HOUR. IT HAS DISORGANIZED CONSIDERABLY IN PASSING OVER LAND
AND SUSTAINED WIND SPEEDS ARE NOT AS HIGH AS THEY WERE. IT IS
NOW EXPECTED TO PASS INTO THE ATLANTIC SOMEWHERE SOUTHEAST OF
DAYTONA BEACH BEFORE MIDNITE. AS IT TRAVERSES THE STATE WINDS
IN ORANGE LAKE SEMINOLE AND OSCEOLA COUNTIES MAY PICK UP TO 35
MILES PER HOUR AND PERHAPS IN SQUALLS AS HIGH AS 50 MPH AT TIMES.
THE HIGHEST SUSTAINED WINDS SPEED SO FAR REPORTED AT ORLANDO
HAS BEEN 25 MPH AND THE HIGHEST GUST 38 MPH.

THE AREA AND TIME OF THE TORNADO WATCH HAS BEEN EXTENDED TO INCLUDE
ORANGE LAKE SEMINOLE AND OSCEOLA COUNTIES FROM NOW UNTIL 6PM.
THIS MEANS THAT THE POSSIBILITY EXISTS FOR A TORNADO OR SEVERE
THUNDERSTORM OR TWO TO OCCUR IN THESE COUNTIES UNTIL THEN IN ADDITION
TO LESSER WINDS AND RAIN FROM ABBEY. SO FAR APPROXIMATELY FOUR AND
ONE HALF INCHES OF RAIN HAS FALLEN IN ORLANDO.
