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COMMANDANT INSTRUCTION 1131.23

Subj: Direct Commission Programs

Reff::

- (a) Personnel Manual, COMDTINST M1000.6 (series), Art. 1-A-5
- (b)) Reserve Administration and Training Manual, COMDTINST
 M1001.26 (series), Sec. 3-B
- 11 PURPOSE: The purpose of this Instruction is to publish the eligibility requirements for all direct commission programs. The contents of this Instruction apply to all military personnel and to civilians applying for direct commission programs.
- DIRECTIVES AFFECTED: COMDTINST 1001.24 (series), COMDTINST 1120.11 (series), COMDTINST 1120.12 (series), COMDTINST 1120.18 (series), COMDTINST 1120.20 (series), COMDTINST 1131.17 (series), and COMDTINST 1131.18 (series), are hereby cancelled.

3. BACKGROUND:

a. This Instruction is intended to provide information about each of the Coast Guard's direct commission programs and the qualification criteria for application to each.

DISTRIBUTION - SDL No. 130

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- 3. bl With the exception of certain Ready Reserve Direct Commission (RRDC) and Physicians Assistants (PA) applicants, all applications for these programs must be submitted to Commandant (G-PRJ-1) via a Coast Guard recruiting office and the appropriate regional recruiting command. All application procedures are contained in reference (C).
 - c. Applicants for the RRDC program who are currently serving in the Coast Guard or Coast Guard Reserve shall apply in accordance with the provisions of references (b). All other RRDC applicants shall apply via a Coast Guard recruiting office and the appropriate regional recruiting command in accordance with the procedures contained in reference (c).
 - d. The address and telephone number of the nearest Coast Guard recruiter may be obtained by dialing 1-800-424-8883.

4. REOUIREMENTS COMMON TO ALL DIRECT COMMISSION PROGRAMS:

- a. Citizenship. Applicants must be citizens of the United States.
- b. Physical.
 - (1) Direct Commission Aviators.
 - (a) Pass a Class I, Service Group I, flight physical examination as specified in Chapter 3 of the Medical Manual, COMDTINST M6000.11 (series). A complete military flight physical, if administered by any of the Armed Forces within 6 months of the selection board, will be considered acceptable if it contains all data required in a Coast Guard aviation physical.
 - (b) Successfully demonstrate the ability to swim 75 yards while dressed in an uninflated, normally equipped lifevest, flight suit and boots. Helicopter crew members must also wear a helmet. During the swim the DCA applicant shall demonstrate the breast stroke, elementary back stroke, and side stroke for at least 15 yards each. Helicopter crew members must successfully complete the Navy's underwater egress course which includes the 9D5 training device.
 - (2) For all other programs, applicants must meet physical requirements for a direct commission, Coast Guard Reserve, as specified in Chapter 3 of the Medical Manual, COMDTINST M6000.1 (series).

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- Coast Guard Officers. Persons currently holding a 4 1 commission in the Coast Guard or Coast Guard Reserve, are not eligible to apply for a direct commission if they are . on the Active Duty Promotion List (ADPL). If a Reserve officer on the Inactive Duty Promotion List (IDPL)) meets the criteria for one of the direct commission programs, they may apply for the program provided a conditional resignation, approved by G-RSM, is included in the application. Reserve officers who meet the criteria for a direct commission may also apply for extended active duty to Commandant (G-PO) via their chain-of-command. Persons who have served or are serving in the Coast Guard Reserve, and who were not selected for integration/ extension, are not eligible to apply.
 - dl Conscientious Objectors. Any person who is a conscientious objector, whether or not so classified, is not eligible. Persons whose religious beliefs conflict with their ability to perform unrestricted service on a 24-hour, 7 day per week basis are not eligible.
 - e. Military Status.'
 - (1) All selectees who currently hold regular or reserve commissions and are serving on active duty must be discharged from the losing service at least two calendar days before being administered the oath for commissioning in the Coast Guard Reserve. The oath must be administered early enough to allow sufficient travel time to Reserve Training Center, Yorktown, VA, for the Direct Commission Officer (DCO) course. This is necessary to ensure that active duty entitlements and service precedence begin anew upon commissioning in the Coast Guard Reserve.
 - (2) Applicants on active duty in another service may not apply unless such application includes a statement from the losing service to the extent that the applicant has an approved release date, or has no service obligation remaining and is eligible to resign, or that any remaining service obligation would be waived to allow resignation in time for appointment to the Coast Guard. A statement that the member will be released upon appointment is not adequate for meeting this prerequisite. Clearance from the losing service, and provision of proof of such clearance, is the sole responsibility of the selectee. Selectee will not be appointed until such proof is provided.

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- 4. e. ((3)) Applicants serving in the inactive Reserve component of another service must include a DD-36% or provide a Statement of Conditional Release from the losing service.
 - (4) Applicants with 10 or more years of non-Coast Guard active duty time will not be considered for appointment.

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f: Training. Officers appointed under these programs shall attend the 4 week DCO course at the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve Training Center in Yorktown, Virginia unless otherwise stated.

5. DIRECT COMMISSION AVIATOR.

- a. Under this program prior service aviators may apply for direct commission in the Coast Guard Reserve at the grade of lieutenant (junior grade) ((0-2)) or ensign ((0-1)). The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
- b! Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 4 years on active duty.
- c. Eligibility Requirements:
 - (1) Age. Must not have reached age 32 as of the scheduled DCO course convening date. No adjustment shall be made for past military service.
 - (2) Education.
 - (a) Must have a baccalaureate degree, or
 - (b) Have attained **25th-percentile** scores on all parts of the **DANTES** General Examinations of the College Level Examination Program, or
 - (c) Must have completed one year of study (30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours) at an accredited degree granting college or university, and
 - 10 Have satisfactorily completed one college level course in mathematics, or
 - 20 Have passed the **DANTES** General Mathematics Examination of the College Level Examination Program.

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- 51 c. (3) Experience and professional qualifications.
 - (a) Have served on active duty, other than active duty for training, as a pilot in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, or Marine Corps for a minimum of 2 years but not to exceed 10 years.
 - (b) For appointment to lieutenant (junior grade), must have served as a commissioned officer in pay grade 0-2 or higher. For appointment to ensign, must have served as a commissioned officer in pay grade 0-1 or ess an Army chief warrant officer.
 - (C) Be a graduate of a'W. S. military flight program.
 - (d) Have a minimum of **500** hours of military flight time as of the published application deadline date. Flight hours in training do not count toward this **to#tal**..
 - (e) Have full time military or civilian pilot experience within 2 years of published application deadline date.
- 61 DIRECT COMMISSIONING OF STATE AND FEDERAL MARITIME ACADEMY GRADUATES.
 - a. Under this program graduates of State and Federal Maritime Academies may apply for a direct commission in the Coast Guard Reserve at the rank of ensign or lieutenant (junior grade). The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
 - b! Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 3 years on active duty.
 - c. Eligibility Requirements:
 - (1) Age. As of the date of the scheduled DCO course convening, applicant must be at least 21 years, and, for appointment to ensign, must not have reached age 27; and for appointment to lieutenant (junior grade), must not have reached age 28. No adjustment shall be made for past military service.
 - (2) Education. Prior to commissioning an applicant must be a graduate of a State or Federal Maritime Academy. Applications may be initiated during the applicant's final academic year if all other requirements are met.

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- 6. C. ((3)) Experience and professional qualifications.
 - (a) For appointment to ensign: applicant must hold one of the following licenses prior to commissioning: Third Mate (unlimited - Oceans or Coastwise); Third Assistant Engineer (any , horsepower); or higher.
 - (b) For appointment to lieutenant (junior grade): in addition to the above qualifications, applicant must have served 1 or more years, as of commissioning date, on board vessels of the United States in the capacity of a licensed officer. Credit for up to 1 year may be given for service on board vessels considered equivalent to merchant vessels or for service on other commercial marine activities engaged in energy exploration on the outer continental shelf.

7. DIRECT COMMISSIONING OF PRIORE-TRAINED MILITARY OFFICERS.

- a. Under this program, former military officers with academic degrees in critical need areas or who have been trained in special need areas as determined by Commandant (G-PO) will be considered for direct commissioning. Applicants will be considered for direct commission in the Coast Guard Reserve at the rank of ensign or lieutenant (junior grade). The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
- b. Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 3 years on active duty.
- C. Eligibility Requirements:
 - (1) Age. As of the scheduled DCO course convening date applicant must be at least 21 years and have not reached 32 years. No adjustment shall be made for past military service.
 - (2) Education. Must have a high school diploma. However, individuals with a bachelor's degree or higher are preferred.
 - (3) Military Training. An applicant must have completed at least 2 but not greater than 10 years of active duty commissioned service in a U.S. Armed Service, Reserve component thereof, or National Guard. The last day of active duty service must be within 4 years of the expected commissioning date.

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- 8. DIRECT COMMISSIONING PROGRAM FOR ENGINEERING OFFICERS.
 - a. Under this program persons with engineering academic degrees may apply for a direct commission in the Coast Guard Reserve at the ranks of ensign, lieutenant (junior grade); and lieutenant. The selection board will make the rank determination for each selectee based on the criteria outlined below. The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
 - b! Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 3 years on active duty.
 - c. Eligibility Requirements:
 - (1) Age. At convening date of DCO course: for appointment to ensign, must not have reached age 27; for appointment to lieutenant (junior grade), must not have reached age 28; and for appointment to lieutenant, must not have reached age 34. No adjustment, shall be made for past military service.
 - (2) Education, experience and professional qualifications.
 - (a) Applicants holding master's degrees in civil engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering, or architecture; or having bachelor's degrees and 3 years relevant work experience in those fields, will be considered for commissions up to the grade of lieutenant.
 - (b) Graduates of 4 year degree programs in civil engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering, or architecture, that have 1 year of relevant work experience; and graduates of 5 year programs in the above fields will be considered for commissions up to the grade of lieutenant (junior grade).
 - (C) Graduates of 4 year programs in civil engineering, electrical engineering, or mechanical **engineering**, who do not have 1 year of relevant work experience will be considered for commissions as an ensign.
 - (d) Candidates holding degrees in building construction, construction management, and engineering technology will be individually considered for waivers to apply.

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- 9 DIRECT COMMISSIONING OF SELECTED SCHOOL GRADUATES.
 - a. Under this program, selected school graduates may apply for direct commission in the grade of ensign in the Coast Guard Reserve. The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned.
 - b. Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 3 years on active duty.
 - c. Eligibility Requirements:
 - (1) Age. As of the scheduled DCO course convening date, applicant must be at least 21 years and must not have reached age 27. No adjustment shall be made for prior service.
 - (2) Education. Prior to commissioning an applicant must have earned and received a bachelors degree from one of the selected schools designated for this program. Applications may be initiated during the applicant% final academic year if all other requirements are' met, The selected schools are:

Norwich University
Prairie View A & M University
Texas A & M University
Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University

Graduates of other institutions with solid academic curricula and strong Reserve officer training traditions will be considered on a case by case basis.

- (3) Military training. Applicant must have successfully completed at least 2 years of Reserve training (ROTC, NROTC, AFROTC)) during -the undergraduate period,
- 10. DIRECT COMMISSIONING OF LAW SCHOOL GRADUATES AS LAWYERS IN THE COAST GUARD RESERVE.
 - a. Under this program, graduates of accredited law schools may apply for appointment in the Coast Guard Reserve at the rank of lieutenant. The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
 - b. Applicants appointed who have been admitted to practice as a member of the bar of any State or the District of Columbia shall serve a minimum of 4 years on active duty. Applicants appointed who have <u>not</u> been admitted to practice as a member of the bar of any State or the

- JAN 6 (CONT'd)) District of Columbia shall serve a minimum of 2 years on active duty. If within the 2 years period the appointee gains bar admission, their contract will be extended to a total of 4 years.
 - c. In addition to the DCO course, selectees shall attend a course for new law specialists at Naval Justice School in Newport, Rhode Island.
 - d. Eligibility Requirements:
 - (1) Age, As of the scheduled DCO convening date, candidate must not have reached age 38.
 - (2) Education.
 - (a) Have graduated not later than 1 July of the year in which the application is considered from an accredited law school.
 - (b) Present evidence of application to take an examination for admission to the bar of a Federal District Court or the highest court of a State or territory of the U. S. or the District of Columbia or present evidence of current admission to such bar.

11. READY RESERVE DIRECT COMMISSION OFFICER PROGRAM.

- a. Under this program individuals may apply for a direct commission in the Coast Guard Selective Reserve at the ranks of ensign, lieutenant (junior grade), and lieutenant. Warrant officers may apply for ensign through lieutenant. Enlisted candidates may apply for a direct commission at the rank of ensign. Prior or current officers may apply for the highest grade held, up to lieutenant (O-3), The date of rank will be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
- b. Applicants who receive commissions shall be assigned to Selected Reserve units.
- C. Enlisted and non-prior service candidates appointed under this program are required to attend the 2 week Reserve Officer Candidate Indoctrination (ROCI) Course prior to commissioning. Those who have held a commission or warrant appointment in the Navy or CG are normally not required to attend.
- d! Eligibility Requirements:

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- 11. d. (1) Age: As of 1 July following the Headquarters Ready Reserve Selection Board that will consider the applicant, applicant must be at least 21 but not have reached 36 years of age.
 - (2) Education.
 - (a) Must have a bachelor's or higher degree, or
 - (b) be at least E-4 and have passed the most recent Servicewide Examination for E-5 (do not have to be above the promotion cut-off), and
 - (C) have completed the Initial Active Duty for Training (IADT) required of their program.

 Members in the RX program must have completed Reserve Enlisted Basic Indoctrination (REBI), if required, and
 - (d) Have successfully completed 2 years (60 semester hours or the equivalent quarter hours) at an accredited degree granting college or university. CLEP examinations (with the ACE recommended score for exams taking prior to May 1986 and a score of at least 421 for exams taken after May 1986) may be substituted for up to 30 semester hours.
 - (3) Testing. Attain a minimum qualifying score of 36 on the Officer Aptitude Rating (OAR) exam. Former or current officers and chief warrant officers of the Armed Forces, regular or reserve, who have served at least one year in commissioned status are not required to take this test.

12. COMMISSIONING OF RESERVE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS ON THE INACTIVE STATUS LIST (IDPL),

- a. Under this program, graduates of selected PYA programs may apply for a direct commission in the Coast Guard Reserve at the rank of ensign. The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
- b! Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 3 years in the Selected Reserve.
- C. Officers appointed under this program, without previous experience as a Coast Guard or Coast Guard Reserve CWO(PYA)), will attend the 2 week Reserve Officer Candidate Indoctrination (CROCI) Course.
- d: Eligibility Requirements:

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- 12. d. (1) Age. At least 21 but not have reached age 36 by 1 July following the Headquarters Ready Reserve Selection Board that will consider the applicant for selection. No adjustment will be made for past military service.
 - (2) Education.
 - (a) Must have a baccalaureate degree, and
 - (b) Prior to appointment, an applicant must have successfully completed a course of study in a Physician's Associate/Assistants Program approved by the American Academy of Physician% Assistants, Alexandria, VA, (703)) 836-22772. A list of approved programs is included as enclosure (1).

13. ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGER DIRECT COMMISSION PROGRAM

- a. Under this program graduates of accredited graduate and undergraduate programs in environmental management, environmental science, environmental economics or related fields, may apply for appointment in the grade of lieutenant(jumion grade) (0-2) or lieutenant (0-3) in the Coast Guard Reserve for initial assignment in the marine environmental protection program. The date of rank shall be the date of appointment to commissioned status in the Coast Guard Reserve.
- bl Applicants who receive commissions shall serve a minimum of 3 years on active duty. Applicants offered an appointment will be counseled on long term career opportunities and will be encouraged to accept an appointment to the grade of lieutenant (junior grade) should the applicant desire to pursue a long-term career in the Coast Guard.
- C. In addition to the DCO course, selectees will normally attend the Port Operations course at the Reserve Training Center, Yorktown, Virginia.
- d! Eligibility Requirements:
 - 1. For Lieutenant:
 - (a) Age: Must not have reached the age of 38 as of DCO class convening date.
 - (b) Education and experience:

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- 13. d. 1. (b) (1) Doctorate from an accredited program in environmental management, environmental science, environmental economics or related field and 1 year of relevant work experience, or
 - (2) Master of Science/Arts from an accredited program in environmental management, environmental science, environmental economics or related field and 4 years of relevant work experience, or
 - (3) Bachelor of Science/Arts from an accredited program in environmental management, environmental science, environmental economics or related field and 6 years of relevant work experience.
 - 21 For Lieutenant (junior grade):
 - (a) Age: Must not have reached the age of 34 as of DCO class convening date.
 - (b) Education and experience:
 - (1) Master of Science/Arts from an accredited program in environmental management, environmental sciences, environmental economics, or related field.
 - (2) Bachelor of Science/Arts from an accredited program in environmental management, environmental science, environmental economics or related field and 3 years of relevant work experience.
- 141 ACTION. Area and district commanders, commander of maintenance and logistics commands, unit commanding officers, and Commander, CG Activities Europe shall comply with the contents of this Instruction.
