

Potentilla simplex

Common Cinquefoil



Small yellow flowers and reddish stems. The five leaflets of the compound leaf are typical of cinquefoil. A great groundcover, by itself or try it with wild strawberry (*Fragaria virginiana*) and/or virginiana creeper (*Parthenocissus quinquefolia*) to create a richly textured carpet.

Suggested companions: oaks (*Quercus* sp.), hickories (*Carya* sp.), witch-hazel (*Hamamelis virginiana*), little bluestem (*Schizachyrium scoparium*), wild bergamot (*Monarda fistulosa*), black-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*)
