### Maria Andrade, Boise, ID

Maria Andrade has practiced immigration law for the last 11 years. Ms. Andrade specializes in detention issues and crime related removal defense. For the last two years, Ms. Andrade has served as a consulting attorney and adjunct attorney for the University of Idaho College of Law Immigration Clinic. Ms. Andrade is an active member of the National Immigration Project of the National Lawyer's Guild and a member of the American Immigration Lawyer's Association. Maria E. He received a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star, and he remains a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, Disabled Vietnam Veterans and Survivors of the Khe Sanh. Carter serves on the Board of Directors of several local children's charities. He has won numerous awards, including Judge of the Year from the Narcotics Officers Association, Patriot of the Year in Laguna Beach and the Mayor's Exceptional Citizen's Award in Santa Ana.

### Richard Kammen, Indianapolis, IN

Richard Kammen is a practicing criminal defense lawyer with his office in Indianapolis, Indiana. He concentrates his practice in white-collar defense, complex crimes, health care issues as well as death penalty defense. He is a member of the law firm of Gilroy, Kammen & Hill. ## Andrea Lyon, Chicago, IL

Andrea D. Lvon is an Associate Clinical Professor of Law and Director of the Center for Justice in Capital Cases at DePaul University College of Law. Professor Lyon graduated from Rutgers University in 1973, and from the Antioch School of Law in 1976. She joined the Cook County Public Defenders' Office that year, where she worked in the felony trial division, post-conviction/habeas corpus unit, preliminary hearing/first municipal (misdemeanor) unit, and the appeals division. She has defended over thirty potential capital cases at the trial level and has taken nineteen through penalty phase; she has won all nineteen. In 1990 she founded the Illinois Capital Resource Center and served as its director until joining the University of Michigan Law School faculty as an Assistant Clinical Professor in 1995. A winner of the prestigious National Legal Aid and Defender Association's Reginald Heber Smith Award for best advocate for the poor in the country, she is a nationally recognized expert in the field of death penalty defense and a frequent continuing legal education teacher throughout the country.

### Tom Monaghan, Boise, ID

Tom Monaghan graduated with honors from the University of Washington School of Law in 1994 and is a member of the Order of the Coif. He began his law career in 1994 as a federal law clerk with United States District Judge Alan A. McDonald of the Eastern District of Washington.
