Amy S. Friend Assistant Chief Counsel

Amy Friend joined the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) as assistant chief counsel in January 1998. She is a co-chair of the OCC's Privacy Working Group and chair of the Legislative Advisory Group.

Prior to her work at the OCC, Ms. Friend spent 10 years working for the House of Representatives. Most recently, Ms. Friend was minority general counsel for the House Committee on Banking and Financial Services. She worked for the House Banking Committee from 1991 until 1997, first as counsel to the Subcommittee on Consumer Affairs and Coinage until 1992, and then as counsel to the full Committee.

Ms. Friend began working on the Hill in 1987 as legislative assistant to Congressman Charles Schumer and then as counsel to the Subcommittee on Crime. In 1991, she was legislative director to Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro.

Ms. Friend worked as an associate in Brownstein, Zeidman and Schomer between 1984 and 1986, and then as an associate at Jenner and Block between 1986 and 1987.

She is a graduate of the Georgetown University Law Center and the University of Pennsylvania.
