Summaries of 2008 Community Connect Broadband Grants July 30, 2008

Alaska

Copper Valley Telephone Coop., Inc.

Tatilek, Alaska

Grant Amount: \$1,000,000

County: Valdez-Cordoza; 1st Congressional District

Rural Development funding was awarded to Copper Valley Telephone Coop., Inc. to provide broadband services to Tatilek, Alaska. Tatilek is a traditional Alutiiq coastal village, with 96% of the population being Alaska Natives. The Chugachmiut Clinic and the Tatitlek Community Center will receive free high speed internet access for two years.

Arkansas

Nexus Systems, Inc. Chidester, Arkansas

Nexus Systems, Inc. will use Rural Development funds to provide broadband service to the community of Chidester, Arkansas through a wireless network. Nexus will implement a community center in the main building of the Chidester Municipal Complex. Organizations that will receive broadband service free of charge for two years include: the town hall, police department, library, and senior citizens center.

Almega Cable, Inc. Reader, Arkansas

The community will benefit from increased public safety, improved health care, additional educational opportunities, and economic benefits to all. The Town Hall, Volunteer Fire Department, Volunteer Rescue Squad, and the Reader Community Center will receive two years of free broadband access.

Broadband services will give students of Wabbaseka research capabilities and access to potential opportunities for a higher education.

Broadband will be available to elementary and high school students, which will let them explore and appreciate their Native American heritage while at the same time developing a regional, national, and international outlook. In addition, Brigham Young University's long-distance learning will be available for students wishing to complete courses that enable them to graduate.

The Applegate Community Center will be available to residents free of charge for a two-year period.

With no local library, the center's broadband capability will allow residents access to literature and multimedia movies, news, and entertainment.

The tribe's wireless system will provide access to a number of facilities, including the Tribal Housing Authority, Maintenance and Natural Resource Department, the Stepping Stones emergency Youth Shelter, and the Stillwater Senior Center. The Community Center will offer residents a fully-functional computer lab, educational assistance programs, and distance education courses on telemedicine.

The community center will be used for the training and support of all residents in technical as well as small business functions, such as, Microsoft office, email correspondence, financial spreadsheets, and how to use the internet for research.
