Report Highlights:

There are three main government offices in Thailand that require export certificates for food and animal products; the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the Department of Livestock Development (DLD), and the Department of Agriculture (DOA). There are no changes anticipated despite the recent coup by the military-led Council for Democratic Reform under Constitutional Monarchy (CDRM).

- (b) Certificate of Origin
 - The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry

4.4 Live Animals

4.5 Animal Products

 - Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand
 - Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance

4.6 Processed Meat Products

- (a) Certificate of Free Sale
 - The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
 - The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for one year and can also be applied to multiply shipments of the identical product
 - Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand
 - Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance

(c) Certificate of Origin

- The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
- Thailand accepts a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance only when that declaration is officially certified an authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand

4.7 Boneless Beef and Poultry Meat and Products

- (a) Certificate of Free Sale
 - The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
 - The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for one year and can also be applied to multiply shipments of the identical product
 - Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand
 - Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance

(b) Certificate of Origin

- The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
- Thailand accepts a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance only when that declaration is officially certified an authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand

(c) FSIS Export Certificate

- The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
- The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment
- The plant number specified must be correlated with Letterhead Certificate and USDA Export verification
- Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand

(d) Letterhead Certificate

- The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry;
- The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment
- The plant number specified must be correlated with FSIS Export Certificate and USDA Export verification
- Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand
- (f) Export Verification (required only for boneless beef importation)
 - The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
 - The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment
 - The plant number and FSIS Export Certificate number specified must be correlated with FSIS Export Certificate and Letterhead Certificate
 - Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand

4.8 Processed/ Frozen Seafood

- (a) Certificate of Sanitation and Free Sale
 - The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
 - The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for one year and can also be applied to multiply shipments of the identical product
 - Thailand accepts a U.S. State issued export certificate when officially certified of authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand

- Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance
- (b) Certificate of Origin
 - The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry
 - Thailand accepts a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance only when that declaration is officially certified an authenticity by the authorized staff in the embassy of the exporting country in Thailand

SECTION V. OTHER CERTIFICATION/ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS

Although the Thai FDA has imposed bans on certain food products, nearly all products are allowable for entry to Thailand. However, the importation of these eligible products is subject to one or more of additional requirements/procedures, including an import permit, product registration, and food labeling. Details of these conditions are available in TH6074 report (FAIRS report for 2006).

In addition, both the DOA and the DLD require import permits. The procedure of import permit issuance is arbitrary and non-transparent. The Thai Government is implementing a long-dormant requirement of inspecting individual slaughterhouse or farm facilities that export animals and animal products into Thailand. Efforts have been made to negotiate a system audit, as opposed to a plant-by-plant audit as is desired by the Thai Government.
