FEATURED SPEAKERS

■ BERT GREGORY, AIA

*Mithun Partnership
Seattle, WA*

Bert Gregory, AIA, is president & CEO of Mithun, a 145-person Seattle firm. His progressive, design-oriented architectural background has led to award-winning projects throughout North America and Asia. He is a recognized expert in resource efficient design, speaking nationally on sustainable building and sustainable urbanism.

Mr. Gregory possesses a diverse project background, which includes architectural projects such as IslandWood, the Northwest's innovative outdoor learning center, to urban design plans such as "The Blue Ring," Seattle's ASLA National Honor Award-winning City Center strategy, and Portland, Oregon's, new zero carbon Lloyd Crossing Sustainable Urban Design Plan.

He recently served as president for the Seattle Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. Mr. Gregory's national impact in design leadership has been noted by the AIA, the IIDA and CoreNet Global, which honored Mithun with the 2003 Sustainable Design Leadership Award. Mithun has received three AIA COTE Top Ten United States Green Projects awards, all under Bert's design leadership.

■ MARK HALVERSON, PE, CEM

*Pacific Northwest National Laboratory
Richland, WA*

Mark Halverson has worked for the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE's) Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) since 1979. He is currently a senior research engineer in charge of commercial building code and standard development for DOE's Building Energy Codes Program (BECP).

He has been active in the development of ASHRAE Standard 90.1 since the early 1990s, starting with the development of the codified version of ANSI/ASHRAE/IESNA Standard 90.1-1989 and continuing through to the present ANSI/ASHRAE/IESNA Standard 90.1-2001. He has also been involved in DOE's work with the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), beginning with the development of what is now Chapter 8 of the 2003 IECC. He has provided training on Standard 90.1 for DOE, ASHRAE and a number of states.

Mr. Halverson holds bachelor's and master's degrees in chemical engineering. He is a registered professional engineer in the state of Washington and a Certified Energy Manager from the Association of Energy Engineers.

■ NIGEL HOWARD

*U. S. Green Building Council
Washington, DC*

Nigel Howard is vice president and director of LEED and International Programs for the U.S. Green Buildings Council. He describes himself as a lapsed chemist and came to the U.S. from the United Kingdom in September 2001.

In the UK, Mr. Howard was director of the Center for Sustainable Construction responsible for teams working on the UK's buildings' rating system—BREEAM, Life Cycle Environmental Assessment of buildings and materials and the ENVEST design tool, Sustainable Communities and a major government

project promoting an Agenda for Change in the UK construction industry.

He has researched most aspects of the environmental impact of buildings and their implications for transport and has contributed to the design teams for many acknowledged green buildings. Mr. Howard has worked for the Greater London Council's Scientific Branch, British Gas plc, the Building Research Establishment and Davis Langdon and Everest Consultants. He has also worked as an independent consultant and lectured at colleges and universities.

■ STEVE LUONI, ASSOCIATE AIA

*University of Arkansas Community Design Center
Fayetteville, AR*

Stephen Luoni is director of the University of Arkansas Community Design Center (UACDC) where he is the Steven L. Anderson Chair in Architecture and Urban Studies. His design and research have won more than 20 design awards, including a *Progressive Architecture Award* for urban design in 1995.

His work at the UACDC and Luoni Gold Design Studio in Florida specializes in interdisciplinary public works projects combining landscape, urban and architectural design. Current work includes design and planning for greenways, residential communities, campuses, municipal parks and big box retail. His work has been published in *Landscape Architecture*, *Progressive Architecture*, *Progressive Planning and Public Art Review*.

He previously taught at the University of Florida and was the 2000 Cass Gilbert Visiting Professor of Architecture at the University of Minnesota. Luoni has a bachelor's of science degree in architecture from Ohio State University and a Master of Architecture from Yale University.

■ JEFFREY SCHERER, FAIA

*Meyer, Scherer & Rockcastle LTD
Minneapolis, MN*

Jeffrey Scherer, FAIA, a founding principal of Meyer, Scherer & Rockcastle, Ltd., has been responsible for the design of more than 90 public and academic libraries over the past 20 years. He is also known for leading the discussion on important issues surrounding libraries today.

Mr. Scherer is a frequent conference lecturer for ALA, IFLA and PLA and has co-authored numerous articles and books on topics such as designing libraries for teens and the aging population, changes in technology and the distribution of information, and sustainable design for libraries. His article, "The Architect, The Library and The Community," is featured in the recent *arcCA* architect in the community issue. He was also recently selected to serve as a member of the Americans for Libraries Council, a national library advocacy group, and on the Illuminating Engineering Society of North America's Library Lighting Standards Committee; he is the only architect to serve both groups.

He is the principal in charge and design architect for the new Fayetteville Public Library—opening October 2004—the State of Arkansas' first LEED-certified project. He holds a Bachelor of Architecture with Honors from the University of Arkansas and has 32 years of professional experience. He was elected into the American Institute of Architects College of Fellows in 1998.

■ JENNIFER SIEGAL

Venice, CA*

Jennifer Siegal is the principal and founder of Office of Mobile Design, a progressive architecture/design studio that is dedicated to the exploration and production of mobile and eco-logic structures. She earned a master's degree from the Southern California Institute of Architecture (SCI-Arc) in 1994, and was a 2003 Loeb Fellow at Harvard University's School of Design where she explored the use of intelligent, kinetic and lightweight materials.

Ms. Siegal's work, including the well-known prefab projects, Portable House and Swellhouse, was exhibited at the prestigious Cooper Hewitt, National Design Museum's 2003 National Design Triennial: Inside Design Now; and the Walker Art Center's *Strangely Familiar: Design and Everyday Life*.

Her innovative design sensibilities and expertise in prefab and green building technologies were recognized by the popular media in 2003 when Esquire magazine named her one of the "Best and Brightest." In the same year, the Architectural League of New York included her in the acclaimed Emerging Voices program. Ms. Siegal is a Full Professor at Woodbury University in Los Angeles, and the editor of *Mobile: The Art of Portable Architecture*, a book and reference guide for architects on the art of transportable environments. Her forthcoming monthly publication series entitled *Materials Monthly* will be launched in 2005.
