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What Works

- Strong laws (.08 BAC, MDA, ALR, etc.)
- High visibility enforcement
 - Checkpoints
 - Saturation patrols
- Sanctions (license suspension, vehicle remedies, etc.)
- Activism
- Shift social norms

General Deterrence Theory

- Classic deterrence theory
 - Human behavior is rational
 - Deviant behavior can be deterred by the prospect of punishment if it is
 - Certain
 - Swift
 - Severe
 - Policing and punishment
 - Retribution and incapacitation
 - Discouraging would-be offenders from engaging in prohibited acts

Types of Deterrence

Specific deterrence

- Prevention of repeat offenses
 - Incarceration
 - License Suspension
 - Vehicle Sanctions


General deterrence

- Prevention of prohibited behavior
 - Increase perceived risk of detection, arrest, and severe punishment


General Deterrence Model Applied to Impaired Driving




Percent of Drivers on the Road With Positive BAC Levels (Weekend Evenings)




Estimated Percent of DWI's Caught (One Year Period)



Frequency Seen Police on the Roads in Past 30 days




Frequency Seen Police on the Roads in Past 30 days - Drivers 18-34

Seen or Heard of Any Special Effort by Police in Past 30 Days to Reduce Drunk Driving - Drivers 18-34



Where Seen or Heard of Special Effort by Police to Reduce Drunk Driving - Drivers 18-34



2005 Focused Countermeasures "Full Implementation Model"

- Sustained enforcement
 - Statewide sTEP enforcement activities at weekly intervals
- Three weekends of high intensity enforcement
 - 16 consecutive nights of unrelenting DWI enforcement, spanning three consecutive weekends

NHTSA Evaluation Support

- Public awareness
 - Telephone surveys
 - before and after the impaired driving mobilizations
 - DMV surveys
- Paid media activity
- Law enforcement activity

NHTSA Evaluation Support

Roadside testing

- Roadside testing surveys in Georgia, Florida, and West Virginia to take direct measurements of drivers' BACs
- Used a device that stores the reading in memory for downloading later. It does not have a display of the BAC
- Conducted at sobriety checkpoints, before, during, and after the mobilizations

Outcome Measures - Immediate

- Night time single vehicle, injury producing crashes by location, investigating agency, driver gender and driver age. Daytime crashes for comparison
- Crash data collected for each week throughout the year plus 3-5 prior years; either sampled or statewide; 2-4 weeks after the crash event

Outcome Measures - Ultimate

Number of fatal and non-fatal alcohol-related crashes (data provided as they become available)
