It is with great regret that we must acknowledge the passing of two members of our group: Shirley Hogg and Donna Parsons.

Shirley Hogge, one of the original Friends members, died of leukemia in June. Shirley and her husband, Don, lived near Lake Lowell for more than 30 years and she was active in protecting the lake and the refuge from encroaching development even before the Friends of DFWR was formed. Shirley carried petitions, passed out leaflets, wrote letters to the editor and attended P&Z hearings in support of open spaces. After joining the Friends Shirley was a Weed Warrior and a Litter Lifter before she became ill. The Friends have lost another original Friends member, <u>Donna Parsons</u>. Donna passed away on August 12th from a second stroke. She was a retired high school science teacher and she staffed many of the different booths we had at local functions. Donna was a great resource of the Action Alert Committee with her knowledge of land use planning over several decades. She served on one of the original Comprehensive Plan Volunteer Citizens Committee. Donna spent her adult life working to better our community and the Friends were fortunate to have her expertise even if it was for only a short time.
