

Little Rock. **FORDYCE HOUSE**, 2115 S. Broadway, 1904, Charles L. Thompson, architect. Frame, narrow clapboarding, shingling brick foundation; 2 1/2 stories rectangular low-pitched hipped roof with dormers, interior chimneys front side entrance in distyle portico in antis with lotiform column capitals, battered walls, prominent window architraves, wide overhanging eaves with frieze brackets; interior features original oak woodwork and wallpaper; minor alterations. Only AR example of Egyptian Revival architecture; residence of John R. Fordyce, prominent 20th C. manufacturer of cotton gin equipment. *Private*.
