OUESTIONS PRESENTED

- 1. Does the exclusion of minorities and persons of color from the jury based upon race, though it gives an appearance the exclusion was based upon facially neutral grounds and upon factors apart from race, deprives a racial minority of equal protection of the laws guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment of the Constitution when it exerts to discriminate against the minority?
- 2. Could a police officer be considered a reliable witness to the accident and his testimony be given greater weight over the testimony of a witness to the accident when he had improperly exercised his authority depriving one of one's due process rights and equal rights protection?
- 3. Did the Trial Court, the Appellate Court, and the Connecticut Supreme Court violate the petitioner's guaranteed rights of due process and equal protection by deviating from the accepted standard of proof, by disregarding the rules of evidence, by basing the facts upon no probative value, and by accepting testimony deficient in any relevant evidence as to the essential element of the case in the light of the evidence proffered by the petitioner?
