MAJOR DUTIES:

Incumbent is an Anesthesia Technician in the Anesthesiology Service, Operative Care Division (OCD) and is a member of the anesthesia care team with responsibilities that include providing general peri-procedural support to OCD providers and their patients throughout the Medical Center. Major duties include positioning and setting up anesthesia machines, including suction, breathing circuit apparatus, gas cylinders, vaporizers, patient monitoring systems, and all additional requested disposables or equipment such as specialty catheters, pressure transducers, and cardiac output sets. Stocks and maintains anesthesia carts and supplies, including specialized carts for cardiothoracic anesthesia, transplant anesthesia, pain management, airway emergencies, malignant hyperthermia, and latex allergy, to assure that appropriate, current drugs and supplies are consistently and immediately available to anesthesia providers in pre-established locations. Incumbent assists anesthesia providers with direct patient care, including patient positioning, connection of standard noninvasive monitoring and warming devices, insertion of intravenous and invasive monitoring devices, initiation of regional anesthetic blocks, advanced airway management techniques, use of a rapid infusion device, use of an intraaortic balloon pump, serving as courier of patient specimens, blood products, and emergency drugs, supplies, and equipment, and providing basic life support measures as medically directed. Performs patient-blood product verification procedure, as the second verifier, when needed. Incumbent is responsible for assessing the need for autotransfusion, operating a red cell recovery machine, keeping accurate autotransfusion records in accordance with Medical Center policy, and performing autotransfusion quality control procedures independently during both scheduled and emergency cases. Cleans machines, carts, and monitoring devices between cases and at the end of the scheduled day. Performs routine operation. maintenance, and repair of all anesthesiology equipment and ancillary laboratory instruments independently and in accordance with established anesthesia technician procedures. Maintains routine and current drug and supply stocks in the anesthesiology workroom; ordering and tracking non-standard drugs, supplies and equipment from pharmacy, SPD, and via the OCD materials manager; assisting the Lead Anesthesia Technician with data collection for new product evaluations; and documenting supplies used during transplant cases. Documents daily workload statistics, and assists in data collection and collation for quality management, educational, and/or research purposes. Incumbent is required to be on call on a rotating basis.
