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Marine Debris in the News

Derelict Fishing Gear Removal in Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary

Ben Cowie-Haskell, Stellwagen Bank NMS, went offshore with local dragger Frank Mirachi to grapple for derelict fishing gear in the sanctuary under a grant from the NOAA Marine Debris Program. This initial effort yielded 4 abandoned wire lobster traps and approximately 2000 feet of rope. More directed trips are planned as well as collection of marine debris during Capt. Mirachi's routine fishing operations.

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Gulf of Mexico Marine Debris Project's Public Service Announcement Playing



The <u>Gulf of Mexico Marine Debris Project's</u> public service announcement (PSA) is now playing on a number of radio stations in the Gulf region. The PSA sends listeners to the <u>NOAA Marine Debris Program</u> Web site, where an large map icon takes them to the project's Web site. Banners on various radio station Web sites send visitors via that route to the project's site. Additional outreach efforts by Sea Grant are underway to let residents in the Gulf region know about the surveys done and information available.

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Reef Clean-up in Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary

Forty-two participants from Reef Rakers will be conducting reef clean-ups off Key Largo during their June 10 to June 16 stay in the Florida Keys. FKNMS staff will meet with the group to present an overview of the sanctuary and provide them with the necessary equipment for the clean up. The Reef Rakers program is a youth led, community based, grass roots, SCUBA certified, environmental enhancement program that is open to any certified SCUBA diver living in Florida's Manatee or Sarasota Counties. The goal of the program is to develop the next generation of environmental stewards, and allow the students to develop the skills necessary to make informed decisions and direct their efforts to improve the underwater ecosystems. Last year, the group removed over 100 lbs. of trash from reefs in the Upper Keys.

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Marine Debris in the Northwest Straits

Out of sight, out of mind... Marine debris, submerged under water, does not receive the same scrutiny and attention it would have gotten had it been out in the open, highly visible, possibly along a busy street or freeway. Fortunately, underwater photos and video footage give us a glimpse of the impact derelict fishing gear have on the environment. "This gillnet became derelict during the first week of gillnetting season in San Juan county in August 2006. The fishing boat suffered mechanical problems and had to be towed in to port. The net was cut because the boat equipment could not function to bring it on board. The boat captain reported the incident and provided the location to the derelict gear hotline hosted by WDFW. The net was removed by the Northwest Straits Commission derelict gear removal team with support from WDFW and Corps of Engineers." (NWS Web site)

World Ocean Day Beach Cleanup in Hawaii a Success

On Friday, June 8th, volunteers participated in a beach cleanup and alien algae removal along Oahu's southeastern coast to celebrate World Ocean Day. Environmental groups B.E.A.C.H. (Beach Environmental Awareness Campaign Hawaii), Malama Maunalua, and Livable Hawaii Kai Hui partnered to sponsor this afternoon cleanup. In addition to the cleanup, volunteers were educated about the effects of alien invasive algae by The Nature Conservancy and marine debris information was provided by the NOAA Marine Debris Program. In total, over 500 pieces of marine debris was removed, along with nearly 850 pounds of alien algae!

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Local Students Talk About Marine Debris at International Conference (NOAA Press Release, June 26, 2007)

Working with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), three sixth-grade students from Our Redeemer Lutheran School in Honolulu presented their school project highlighting the effects of marine debris to an international audience during today's marine debris session at the PACON 2007 conference.

Jordan Wong, Brandon Lim, and Andrew Shiozaki enthusiastically started off the marine debris session with a presentation of their project titled, "Plastic Pollution." They presented to a room of local and international researchers and professionals, reminding all of them of the hope and potential of our next generation.

Having captured the attention of NOAA at the recent Hawaii State Science and Engineering Fair, staff from the NOAA Marine Debris Program worked to find other opportunities for the boys to share their award-winning project and contagious enthusiasm for addressing the issue of marine debris.

"There are few kids that get really excited about marine debris," said Kris McElwee, Pacific Islands program coordinator for the NOAA Marine Debris Program, and NOAA volunteer at the Hawaii State Science and Engineering Fair. "Not only do they know their stuff, they are like salesmen – so enthusiastic that you just have to stop and listen to their presentation. We knew we had to get their project and presentation out there."

Jordan, Brandon, and Andrew's project, "Plastic Pollution," highlights one of the main forms of marine debris—plastics,. In their report, they cite data and information on the effects of plastic debris on marine life and the environment and list ways that people can help to fix this often deadly problem. Along with the information is insight about the problem of marine debris.

"People have been dumping trash into the oceans for a long time and used to think that because the oceans were so big, they could handle the amount of waste. Today we have learned that this trash causes problems for ocean life," begins their paper.

"We are excited to take what we learned a few steps further and to be able to share it at an international conference." said Brandon Lim, one of the student authors of this project. "Also being recognized by NOAA is awesome!"

"Plastic Pollution" won several awards during the Hawaii State Science and Engineering Fair this past April, including one from the NOAA Pacific Services Center, as well as the State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism and University of Hawaii School of Ocean and Earth Science and Technology. Jordan, Brandon, and Andrew also presented their project to marine debris researchers and managers at a meeting earlier this month hosted by the NOAA Marine Debris Program.

The NOAA Marine Debris Program works with other NOAA offices including NOAA Fisheries and the National Ocean Service, as well as other federal, state, and local agencies and private sector partners to support national, state, local, and international efforts to protect and conserve our nation's natural resources, oceans, and coastal waterways from the impacts of marine debris.

In 2007 the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, an agency of the U.S. Commerce Department, marks 200 years of science and service to the nation. From the establishment of the Survey of the Coast in 1807 by Thomas Jefferson to the formation of the Weather Bureau and the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries in the 1870's, much of America's scientific heritage is rooted in NOAA.

NOAA is dedicated to enhancing economic security and national safety through the prediction and research of weather and climate-related events and information service delivery for transportation, and by providing environmental stewardship of our nation's coastal and marine resources. Through the emerging Global Earth Observation System of Systems (GEOSS), NOAA is working with its federal partners, more than 60 countries and the European Commission to develop a global monitoring network that is as integrated as the planet it observes, predicts and protects.

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Marine Debris Internship Opportunity

The Marine Debris Accumulation, Removal, and Impact Assessment Research project is a new project being undertaken by scientists at NOAA's Center for Coastal Fisheries and Habitat Research (CCFHR). This project aims to investigate current debris status (including accumulation rates and environmental impacts) in subtidal and intertidal habitats of North Carolina (NC). This comprehensive approach will provide baseline information and methods needed for a formal underwater marine debris removal program in North Carolina, as well as providing scientifically-determined accumulation rates and environmental impacts of debris in critical salt marsh and nearshore habitats.

The 12-18 month paid internship is for a "Technical Assistant for Marine Debris Accumulation, Removal, and Impact Assessment Project," located in Beaufort, North Carolina.

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Scouts Assist with Beach Clean-up in Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary

On June 13, Team OCEAN staff members Robert Keeley and Jacqueline Laverdure led a group of twenty eight scouts on a beach clean up of Woman Key in the Key West National Wildlife Refuge. The group removed approximately 1500 pounds of debris from the shoreline, including a great amount of entanglement threats. Prior to departure, Robert Keeley gave a briefing on the dangers of marine debris

to habitat and wildlife. Robert also instructed the scouts on how to clean the beach without disturbing turtle nests. Turtle nesting season started in April and will continue through the summer. During the clean up, the scouts rescued a gannet, a pelagic bird rarely found near shore, which was later brought to the Key West Wildlife Center for treatment.

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New NOAA National Marine Sanctuary Program Report Addresses At-Sea Data Collection Standards

The National Marine Sanctuary Program has released a new report to help scientists better integrate monitoring data collected while at sea. The report, entitled "Standardizing At-Sea Monitoring Programs for Marine Birds, Mammals, Other Organisms, Debris, and Vessels, Including Recommendations for West Coast National Marine Sanctuaries," provides guidance to researchers conducting long-term monitoring of seabird and marine mammal populations, taking into account variable funding levels, logistics, vessel platforms and management issues. CORAL REEF RESTORATION PROJECT TO BEGIN IN BROWARD COUNTY - Tire reef project will remove approximately 700,000 tires from seafloor

"The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) will join the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Broward County and U.S. military divers in a pilot project to remove tires from the Osborne Reef, approximately one mile off the coast of Ft. Lauderdale. U.S. Navy, U.S. Army and U.S. Coast Guard divers will salvage the tires from the seafloor as Broward County and NOAA ensure the protection of the living corals in the area. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection is working with the private sector to transport the tires from Port Everglades to be processed into tire-derived fuel (TDF) for use in a Georgia plant that produces recycled paper.

In the 1970s, approximately 2 million tires were placed as an artificial reef in 60-70' of water on sandy bottom between two natural coral reefs. Intended as good fish habitat, the tires instead failed to support marine life and began to harm nearby living coral reefs as storms forced the tires against the corals. This multi-agency partnership will remove the tires and recycle them while protecting the living coral ecosystem.

A media day to cover the project will take place on Thursday, June 7, 2007. Press kits which include B-roll video of the underwater military tire salvage operation as well as video of Broward County's natural and successful artificial reefs will be available on DVD.
