


Connect the Constellation

Badlands is famous for its beautiful scenery. One of the most beautiful sights here isn't the *lands*cape, though, but rather the *skyscape*. Because the park is located so far away from cities' bright lights, it is easier to see the twinkles and glows of stars, planets, satellites, and other celestial phenomena in the dark night.

While gazing into the dark night, people throughout history have seen stories in the sky. They have linked stars together to form special groups called *constellations*.

You may recognize this cluster ...




... to make a constellation depicting Orion the Hunter.

According to Ancient Greek mythology, Orion brandishes a club and/or lion's skin as he and his faithful hunting dogs chase the hare through the night. It is easy to see the three stars that form his belt, as well as the red giant Betelgeuse, which marks one of his shoulders.
