LIVESTOCK REVIEW

CATTLE:

Slaughter cattle trades still limited to northern tier feedlots though a few sales occurred in Kansas and Texas at mostly steady money. Dressed basis sales in Nebraska were \$2.00 lower compared to last week. Compared to last week, prices for feeder cattle weighing over 600 lbs trended steady to \$2.00 lower than 2 weeks ago. The full decline was placed on 600-800 lb cattle that will finish based on the June CME Live Cattle contracts which are currently \$7.00 lower than the current cash market. Slaughter cows sold steady in Colorado and slaughter bulls were not tested last week.

HOGS:

The National Direct trade area, IA/Southern MN, and the Western Cornbelt again sold mixed, from \$.56 lower to \$.38 higher, and the Eastern Direct Cornbelt traded \$1.74 lower for the week. Barrow and gilt trade at St. Paul and Sioux Falls terminal markets closed mixed from \$.50 higher to \$1.00 lower for the week. Compared to last week, early weaned pigs and all feeder pigs traded steady to \$3.00 lower. Demand again moderate for moderate offerings.

SHEEP:

Compared to last week, no comparison on any class due to the holiday trade, but a weaker undertone noted. At San Angelo, TX, last week, 13,466 head sold in a 2 day sale. Equity Electronic Auction sales sold 850 head of slaughter lambs in Wisconsin and Illinois last week. In direct trading slaughter ewes sold \$3.00-4.00 higher and feeder lambs were again not well tested last week.

MEAT REVIEW

BEEF:

The carcass price equivalent index value of a Choice 600-900 lbs. carcass was down \$.11 at \$146.14 for the week. Boxed beef cutout values were steady to weak on moderate demand and moderate to heavy offerings last week. Estimated composite of the boxed beef cutout value of a Choice 600-900 lbs. carcass was down \$.13 at \$155.21 for the week. Cutter cow carcass gross cutout value was estimated at \$105.69 per cwt, down \$.12 from a week ago. The 100% lean items; outside rounds and striploins were firm to higher, inside rounds steady, and eye of rounds, flats/eyes, and S.P.B's were weak to lower on light demand and light to moderate offerings last week.

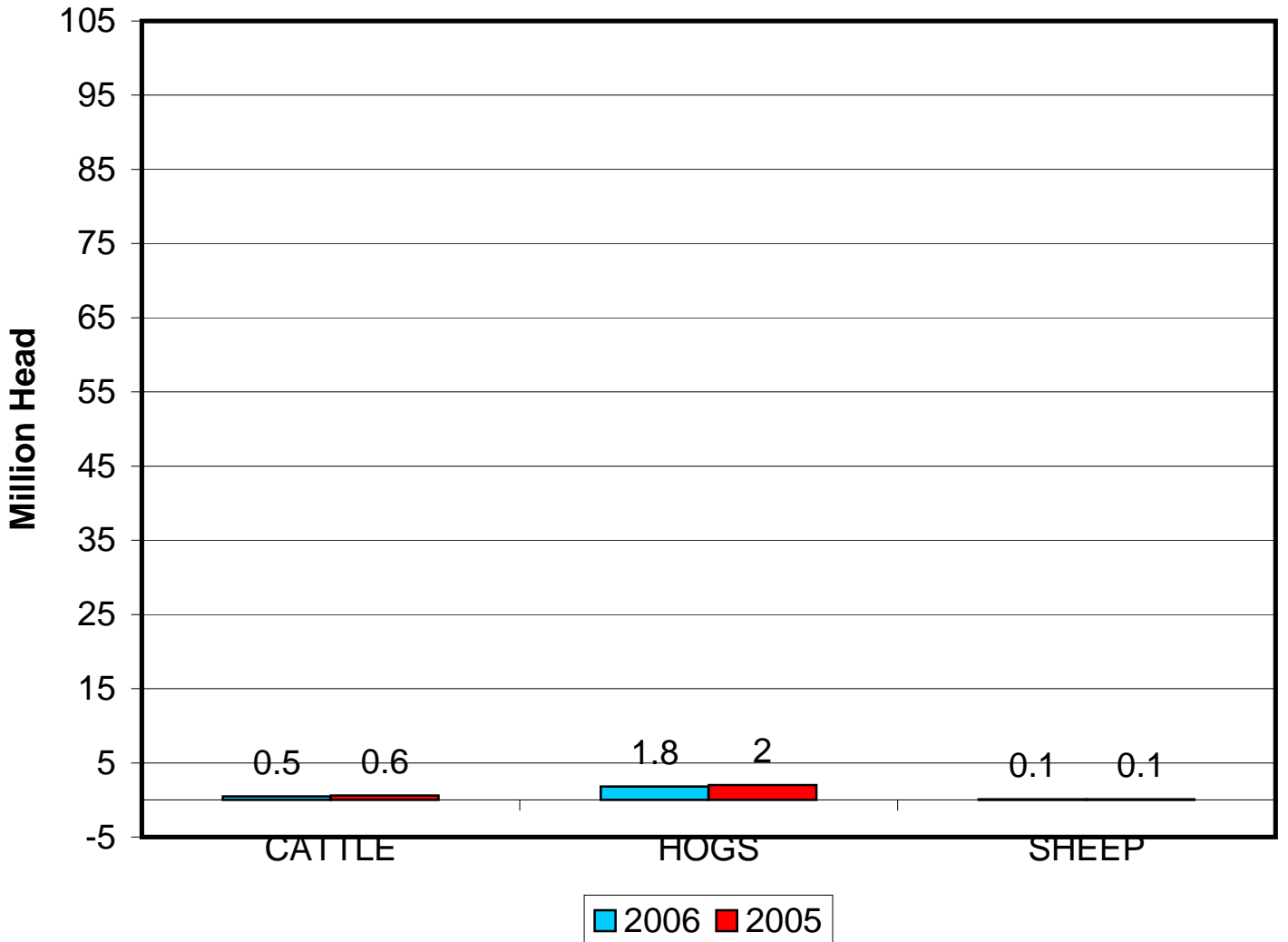

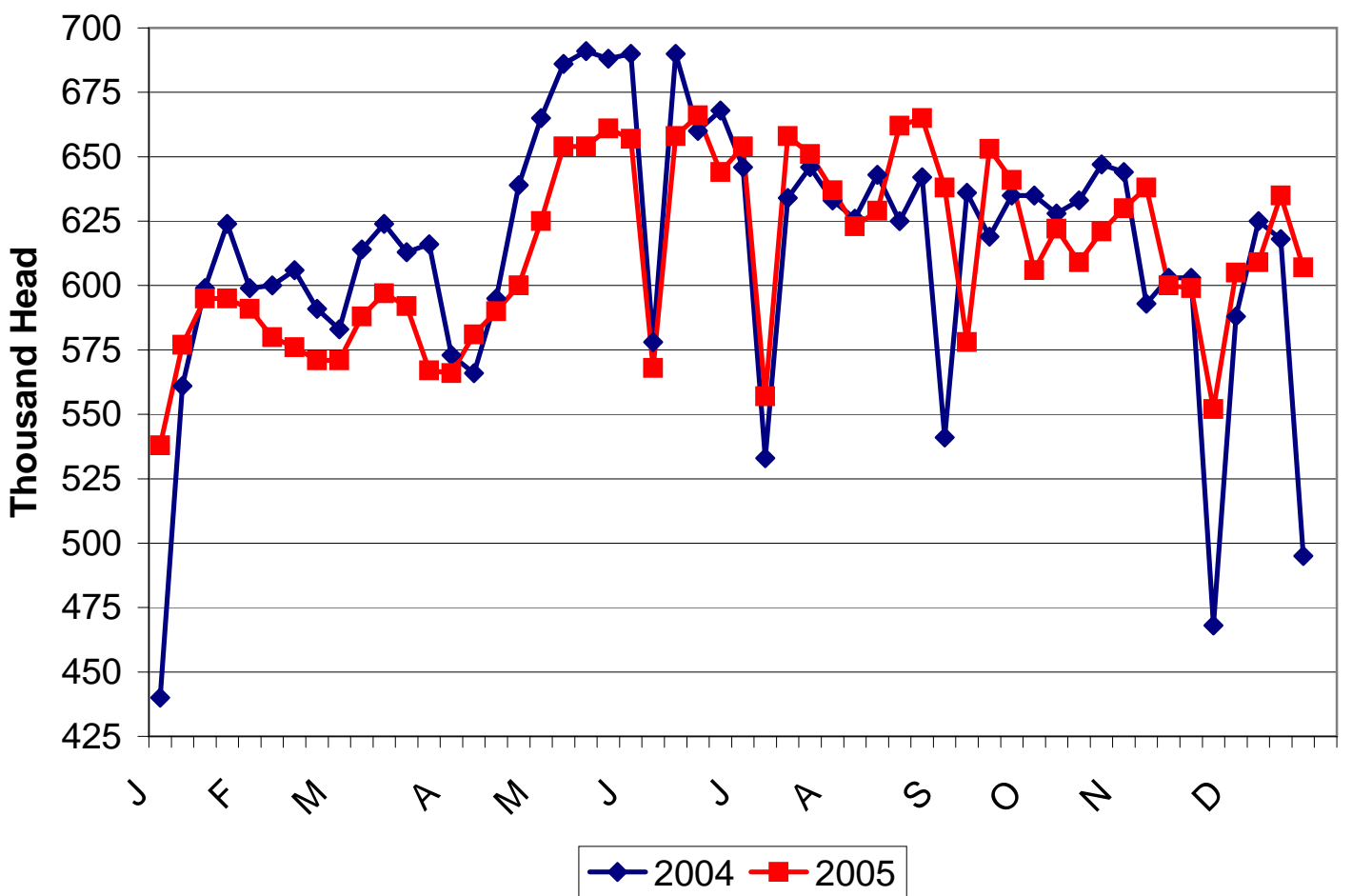

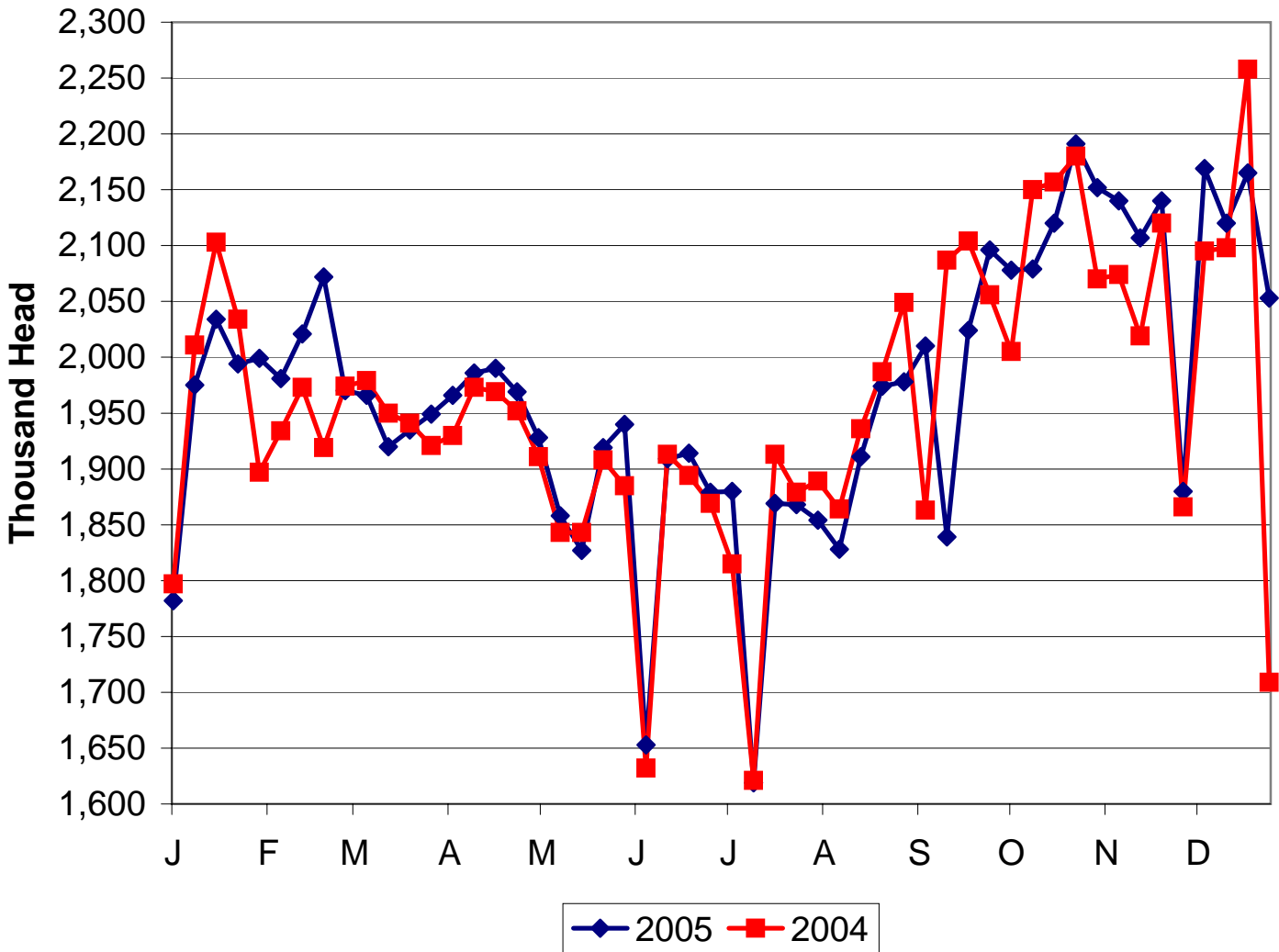
Year to Date Slaughter



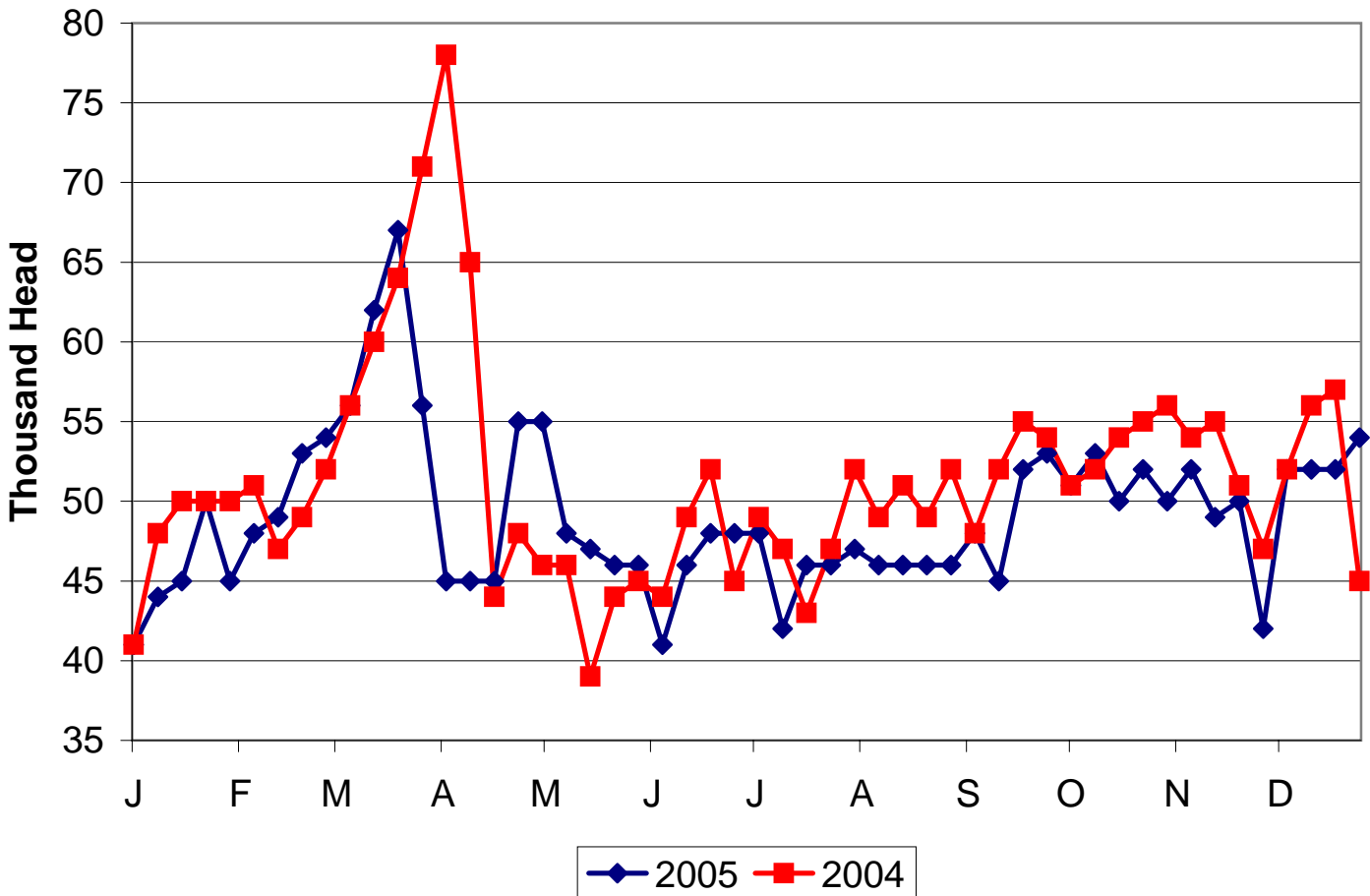
Cattle Slaughter Under Federal Inspection



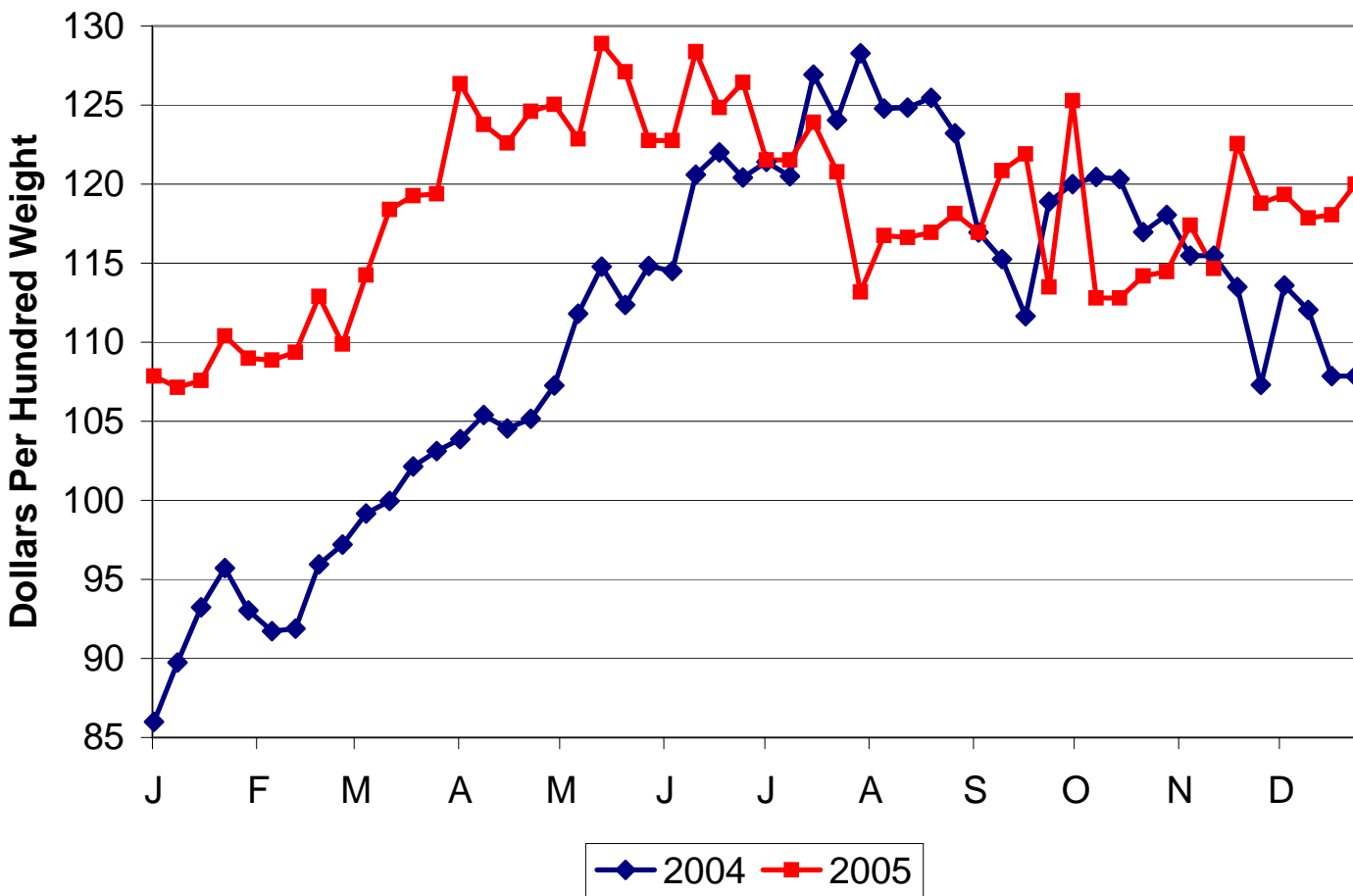
Hog Slaughter Under Federal Inspection



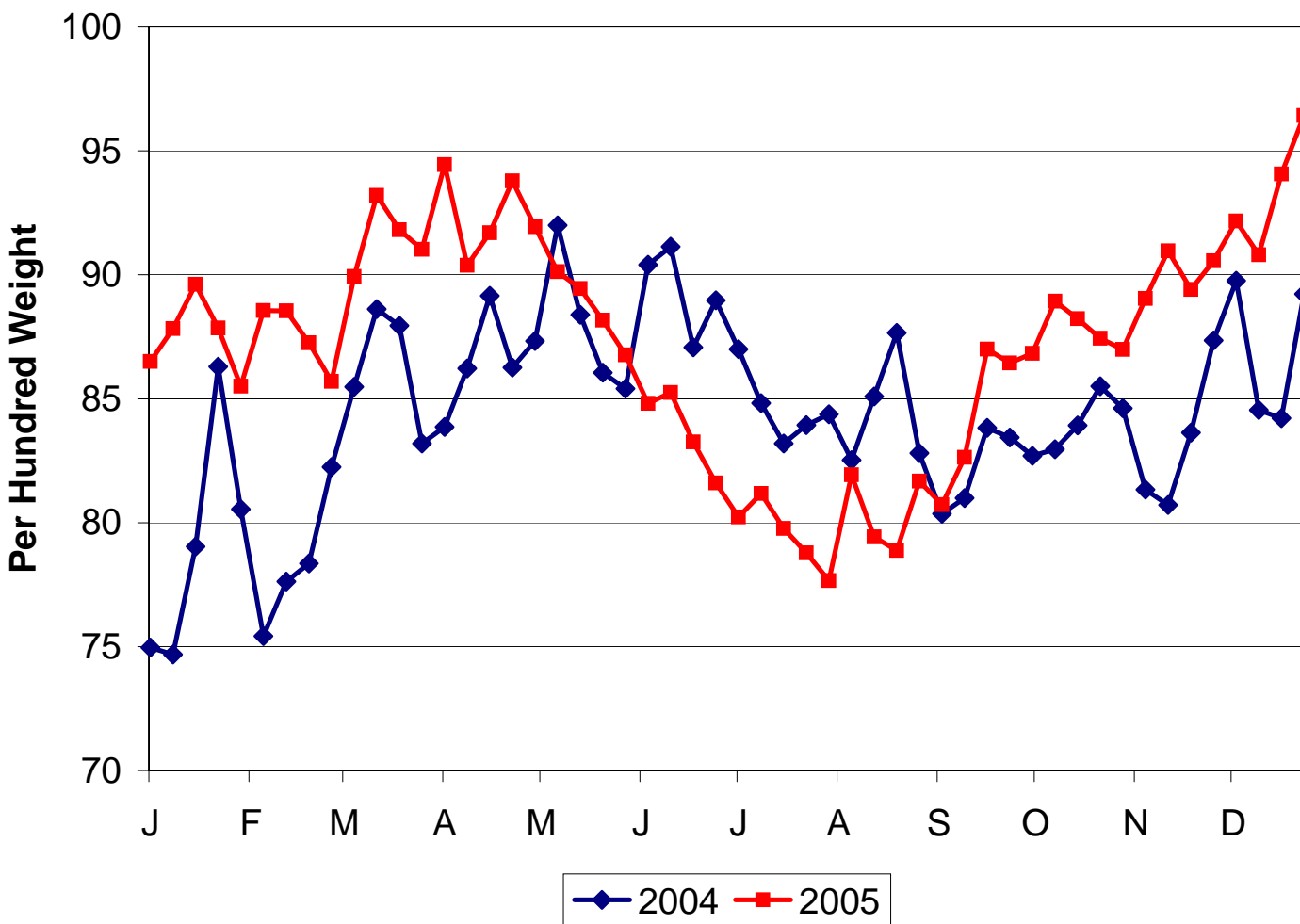
Sheep and Lamb Slaughter Under Federal Inspection

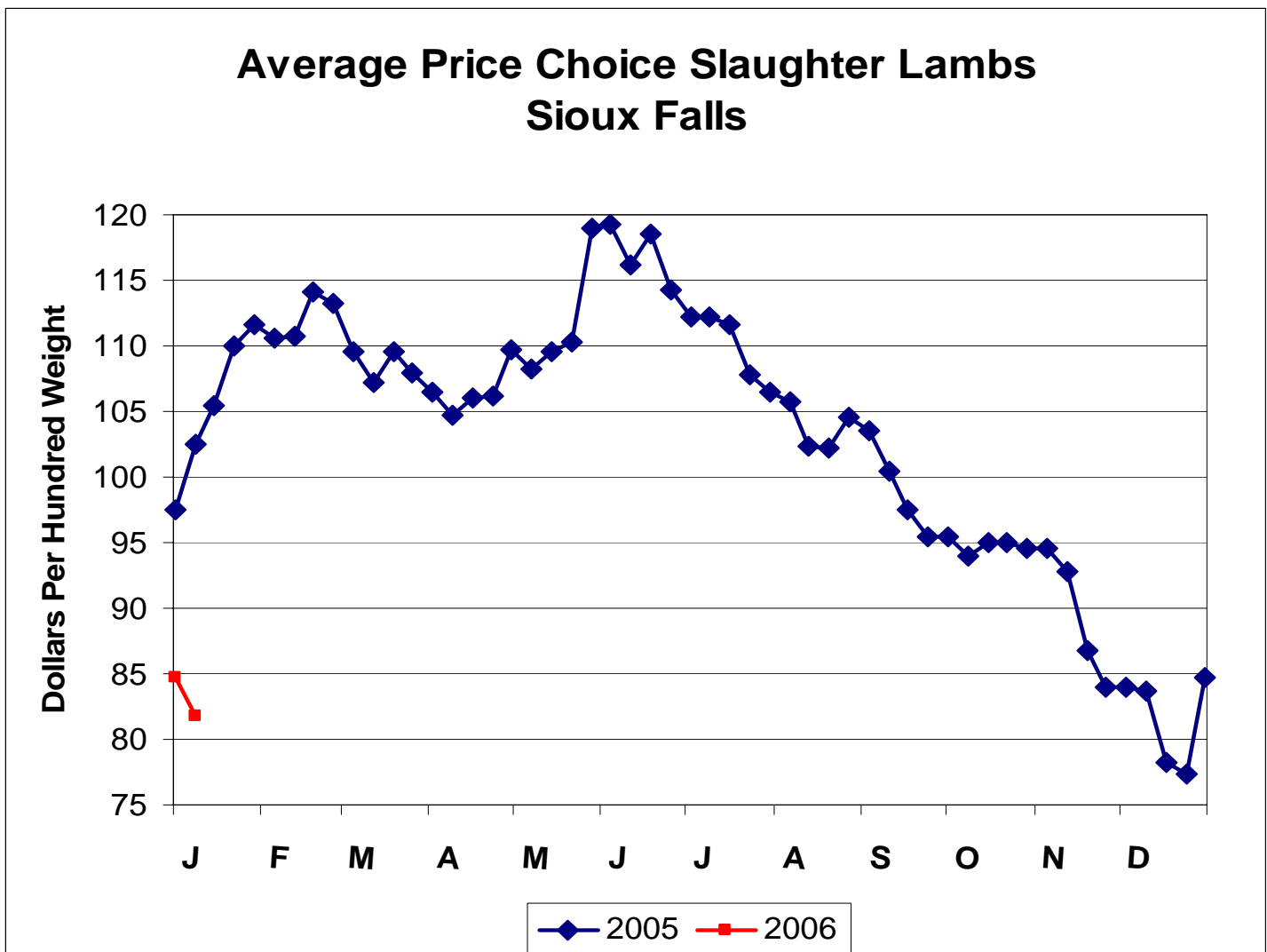

Post holiday activity on beef variety meats in abbreviated workweek very slow. On sausage materials markets, cheek meat untested, hearts ended mostly steady, head meat sharply lower in thin test. Other markets, oxtails moved at slightly lower prices in thin test. Demand very light for light to moderate offerings.

Trading on pork variety meats very slow as markets trending steady to higher with few exceptions. Markets very lightly tested. On sausage materials markets, cheek meat managed slight gain as hearts remained steady. Demand and offerings were light. Export markets inactive on very light demand.

Trading on tallows & greases moderate this week. Good chemical demand saw higher prices on Chicago packer tallow, renderer tallow and choice white grease. Chicago lard also higher on moderate demand for light offerings. Chicago edible tallow steady. The Gulf markets were quiet. Central choice white and yellow grease ended generally steady on moderate feed fat demand.

Protein feed supplements experienced light to moderate trading. Moderate demand and light offerings resulted in higher prices on Central meat and bone meal and steady to higher prices in the Panhandle. The porcine product also steady to higher. Light demand and heavy supplies continued to pressure pork blood meal. Prices ended steady to lower.

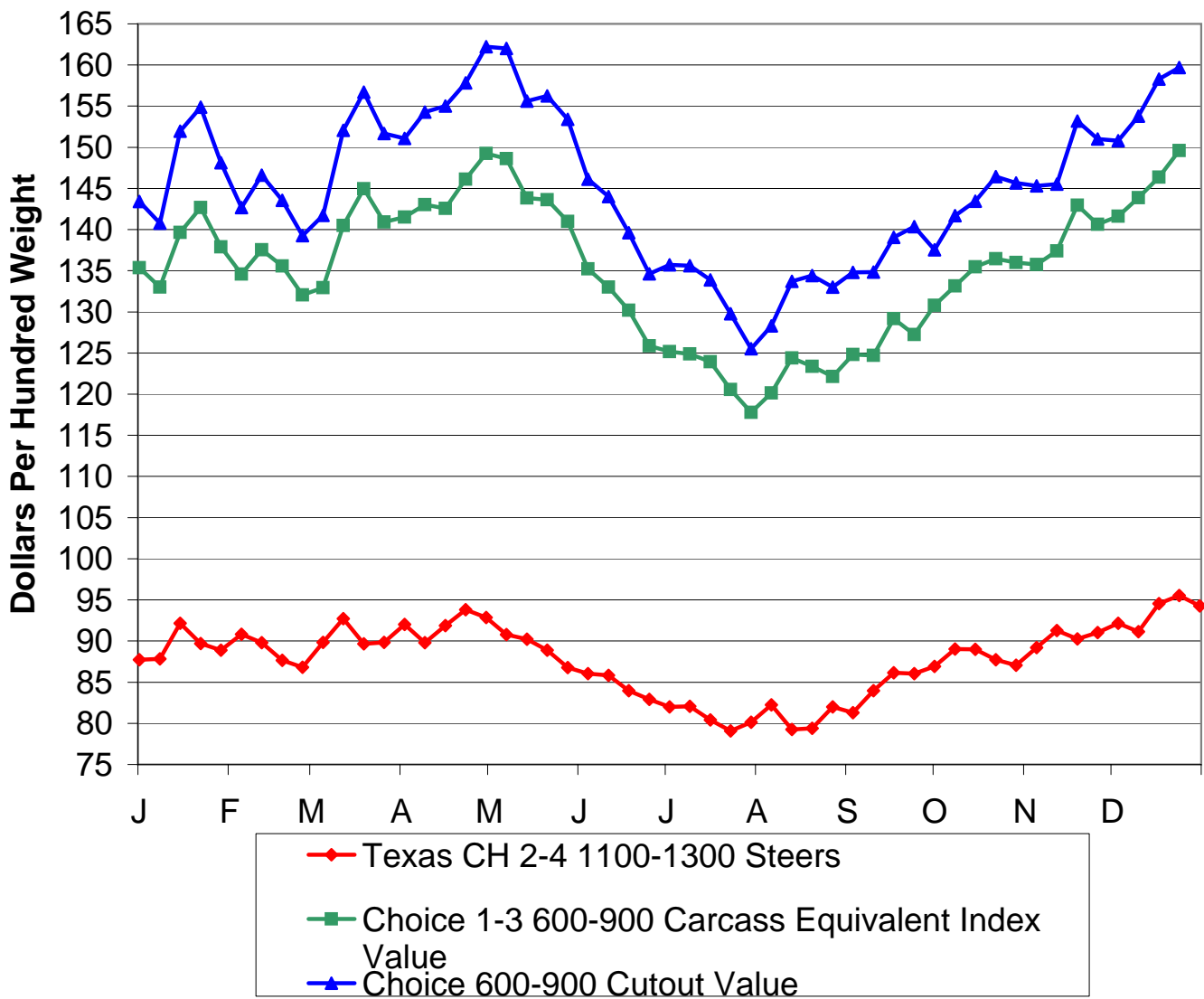

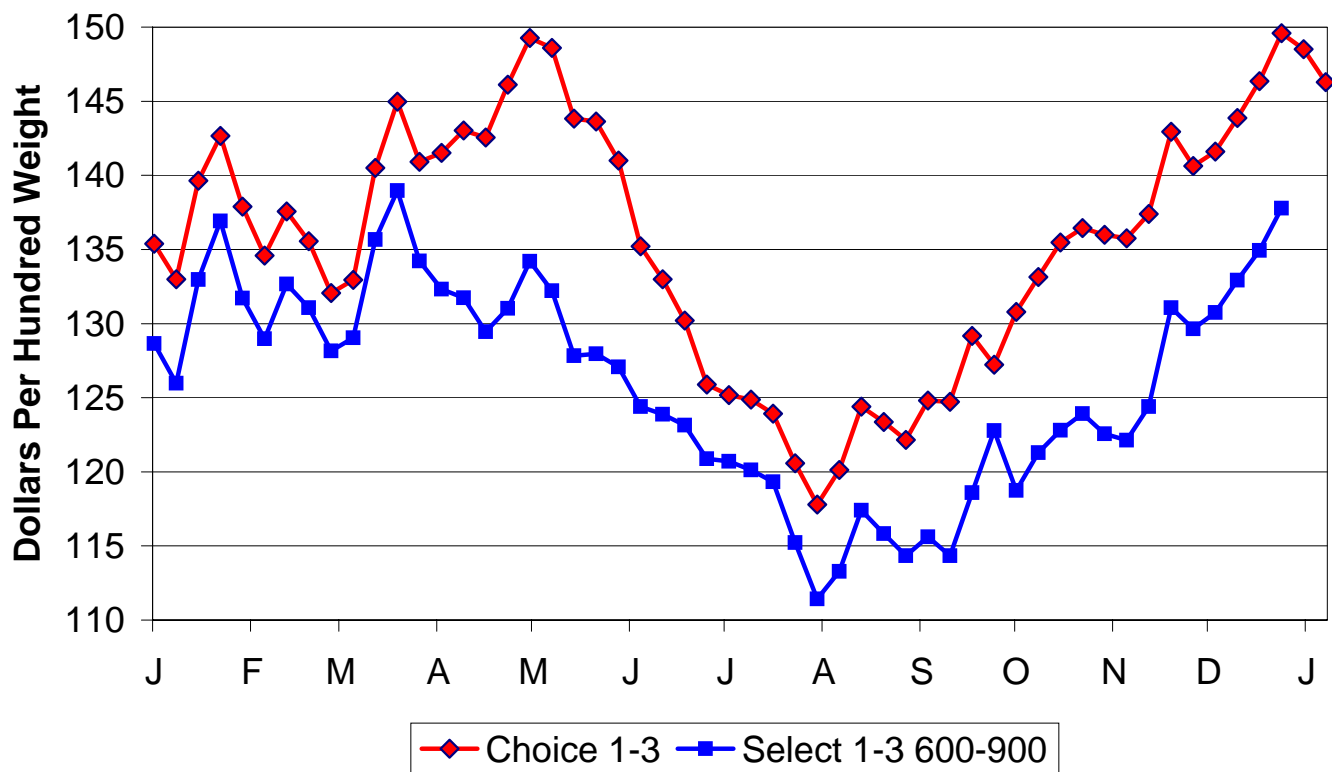
