# BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS DECEMBER, 1999 - FEBRUARY, 2000

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period December 01, 1999 - February 29, 2000. I've compiled only those observations for species which are listed as Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical or Not included (?) on the park's checklist.

The warm and dry conditions that prevailed through the fall continued through the winter season. One good rainfall at Christmas, that fell only at Panther Junction, and a light snowfall in early February provided the entire precipitation total for the winter. Precipitation totals for the three month period as compared to the same period last year (+/-): Panther Junction: 0.71"(+0.56"). Chisos Basin: 0.69"(+0.42"). Rio Grande Village: 0.30"(+0.30"). Castolon: 0.43"(+0.39"). Persimmon Gap: 0.52"(+0.47"). From this data, relative to the same time period last year, it appears we are sitting a little bit better this year, but looking back to this past rain season when the normal late summer/early fall rains didn't happen, we are talking essentially no significant rain since late July.

With the dry conditions, the lack of any major cold fronts pushing down, and a poor seed/fruit crop, things were pretty quiet in the area, particularly with regard to wintering sparrow populations. The unusually early rains of June and July sparked an early grass seed set that was depleted by fall, leaving only the exotic Johnson grass as the primary seed producer for the winter. Wintering sparrows simply moved on to someplace else. The most significant winter sparrow observation came from the Johnson grass flats along the Harte Ranch road on 1/10 when ornithology researcher Melissa Powell saw a Harris's sparrow in a flock of white-crowns.

One possible result of the warmer than usual temperatures was the presence of several species not normally found here in the winter. An example was a female rufous hummingbird that arrived at Panther Junction on 12/23 and stayed through 01/20, providing the first winter record for this species in the park. Other first winter records included a tri-colored heron at Rio Grande Village on 1/27, a burrowing owl on the Tornillo Flat on 12/10, and a hooded oriole at Panther Junction on 12/12. A rare winter Northern parula was present at Cottonwood Campground from 12/22 until at least 1/16. For the third year in a row a pair of green kingfishers were present at the Rio Grande Village Nature trail from 7/11/99 through the end of February. They should be departing soon and I suspect they are nesting somewhere along the river in proximity to the park. There are no breeding records for this species in the park.

There is much talk and prediction of an early spring arrival this year. I quit trying to predict what would happen at spring a long time ago, but just to keep things interesting consider this; elf owls were reported in the Castolon area on February 7, more than two weeks ahead of Wauer's earliest record. Just for a little more fuel, I had two male Lucifer hummingbirds in my yard on March 2, a full 16 days earlier than last year. Whenever the migrants start pushing, it will be a good spring.

### BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS MARCH - MAY 2000

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period March 1 - May 31. I've compiled only those observations for species which are listed as Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical or Not included (?) on the park's checklist. A "?spr" indicates a species which is documented for the park but not in the spring season.

Warmer than average temperatures and continued drought again mark another spring season in the Big Bend. With the last significant rainfall having occurred in July 1999, the area is extremely dry. Year to date precipitation as compared to ytd totals through May 1999 (+ or -) is as follows: Panther Junction; 1.14 " (-0.22"), Chisos Basin; 1.07" (-0.26"), Rio Grande Village; 0.45" (-2.10"), Castolon; 0.99" (-1.35"), and Persimmon Gap; 0.76" (-0.65"). The Rio Grande all but disappeared this spring and most of the oaks in the Chisos Mountains defoliated completely by March. Most springs throughout the park have dried up and the Boot Canyon drainage in the Chisos is completely dry. The spring bloom, with the exception of the ocotillos, essentially didn't happen this year. With this scenario one could have predicted an earlier and perhaps quicker migration, but as always, other factors came into play.

One favorable consequence of the preceding warmer than average winter season and its absence of killing freezes was the survival of over-wintering insect larvae, particularly moths. Beginning in mid-May there was an explosion of moths and both migrant and resident species gorged on this abundant food source. As an example, a male <code>Black-throated blue warbler</code> was present in the interior courtyard at the Panther Junction Headquarters for four days in May. This very tame individual could be easily observed as it spent hours picking moths from windows and doorways, even entering offices in pursuit of the insects. The sudden and ready availability of this food source beginning in mid-May may have had an impact on the duration of the migration. Usually the migration begins to tail off around mid-May, but this year continued strongly right up to the end of the month.

Another factor that probably influenced the migration this year was the lightning caused ignitions of a series of wildland fires in the Sierra del Carmen mountains in Mexico, just southeast of the park and in the Glass Mountains to the north. These fires began in mid-April and continued into early May, obscuring the skies with smoke and perhaps pushing some unusual species our way, especially those species of a more easterly distribution, including yellow-throated vireo, sedge wren, gray-cheeked thrush, blue-winged warbler, Tennessee warbler, tropical parula, Magnolia warbler, prothonotary warbler, and Kentucky warbler.

Harder to explain was a reported  ${\bf rufous\text{-}capped\ warbler}$  in the Green Gulch (slopes below Lost Mine Peak) on 5/01 (Ro Wauer), and two separate reports of a  ${\bf red\text{-}faced\ warbler}$  in Pine Canyon on the  $2^{\rm nd}$ . Both of these birds drew many people to search but unfortunately there were no other confirming reports. In contrast, a pair of  ${\bf dusky\text{-}capped\ flycatchers}$  was well documented along the Laguna Meadow trail beginning April 29, and included an intriguing report from Nicholas Block of possible nesting activity. The latter has yet to be confirmed.

Other highlights for the spring include a nesting common black-hawk at Rio Grande Village. This is the fifth year in a row that black-hawks have returned to the same grove at Rio Grande Village. As last year, we cordoned off an area around the tree soon after the hawks began building the new nest. Beginning May 24 an adult hawk was observed on the ground below the nest for three consecutive days. On the 26<sup>th</sup> I finally went in to investigate and found a downy chick, not more than a week out of the egg, on the ground. The chick had fallen from the nest some fifty feet with no apparent harm, and had been protected by the adult day and night for at least the three day period. We utilized a bucket truck and climbing gear to return the chick to the nest. In spite of concern that too much disturbance had occurred, at last report both adults had returned to the nest and were observed carrying food to the nest.

There has been only one report of Tropical kingbird from Cottonwood this year. Lasley and Lockwood looked for tropicals while here with their VENT trip but were unable to find any.

Researcher Mark Peck returned this year to perform a two week survey (May 23 - June 5) of Black-capped vireo in the park. He located a total of 15 birds (8 males, 7 females) and 4 nests. Of the four nests, two held brownheaded cowbird eggs, one was apparently abandoned, and the last held four vireo eggs. Peck noted that while cowbird numbers did not seem any higher, they were noted in all survey areas, including those where they have not been previously observed (Pine and Juniper Canyons). We speculated that with the extreme drought conditions, many birds are not nesting and the cowbirds are going farther afield to find nests.

Peregrine falcons were monitored through the season, and will continue to be watched until fledging is completed. At this point there are six known eyries and one more possible (compared to 6 last year) and all appear to have nestlings. For the second year in a row, there appears to be no activity along the southeast rim of the Chisos, but an older site between Toll Mountain and Casa Grande is occupied.

Ro Wauer and a group of volunteer counters performed a Colima warbler census May 18 -20. A total of 68 territories were documented, the same as in 1996 when the last census was performed. This year the lower elevation, middle Green Gulch area that was occupied by Colimas in 1996 held far fewer birds, the greater number being found in the more traditional areas higher up. It was noted by observers that Colima males for the most part were not singing, and those that were performed abbreviated songs. This could be an indication that food supplies are insufficient to bring the males into full breeding condition. Many single birds were observed and this year more observations have come in of individuals well below the expected elevation range, including an individual Colima down near the bottom of the Window Trail.

### BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS JUNE - JULY 2000

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period June 1 - July 31. I've compiled only those observations for species which are listed as Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical or Not included (?) on the park's checklist. A "?sum" indicates a species which is documented for the park but not in the summer season.

The dry conditions of the past year broke abruptly on June 1 with heavy rainstorms that continued through the month, providing the area with much needed moisture. The spigots turned off however, after July 3, and the remainder of that month was hot and dry. The rain that did fall in June did allow a nice green-up of the desert regions and the oaks in the Chisos Mountains finally began to leaf out after standing bare for nearly the entire year. Year to date precipitation as compared to ytd totals through July 1999 (+ or -) is as follows: Panther Junction; 5.06" (-3.20"), Chisos Basin; 7.35" (-3.86"), Rio Grande Village; 2.54" (-3.51"), Castolon; 2.77" (-4.80"), and Persimmon Gap; 2.78" (-7.68").

The big highlight of the this summer season was the first confirmed Texas nesting record of **Dusky-capped flycatchers**. The pair nested in a cavity in a large madrone along the lower end of the Laguna Meadow Trail. The presence of the flycatchers was well documented from a first report on April 29 (Smith), nest-building on May 9 (Block), feeding young in the nest June 23 (Freeman, Hockey), and fledging on June 27 (Overton). The latest report so far was of two birds in the same location on July 28.

In the Spring season report I noted that the nesting common black-hawks at Rio Grande Village had hatched one nestling, which we subsequently rescued after it fell from the nest around May 24. As of June 1, both adults and the chick were still at the nest. By June 10 visitor reports of the hawks did not mention any observation of the nestling. On July 1 and 2, I watched the nest for several hours each day and did not see any sign of the chick. The adults were in the area, perched in another cottonwood near an older nest used last two years ago. They did not approach the current nest at any time nor exhibit any behavior that would indicate they were still tending young. At this point it appears, unfortunately, the chick did not survive.

At least one pair of Tropical kingbirds nested again at Cottonwood Campground this year, with adults feeding young on July 27. There may be a second nest near site #7 (where a pair did nest in 1999) but I have been unable to confirm this. This is the fifth consecutive year that tropical kingbirds have been present at Cottonwood.

To reiterate information from the Spring season report, Researcher Mark Peck returned this year to perform a two week survey (May 23 - June 5) of Black-capped vireos in the park. He located a total of 15 birds (8 males, 7 females) and 4 nests. Of the four nests, two held brown-headed cowbird eggs, one was apparently abandoned, and the last held four vireo eggs. Peck noted that while cowbird numbers did not seem any higher, they were noted in all survey areas, including those where they have not been previously observed (Pine and Juniper Canyons). We speculated that with the extreme drought conditions, many birds are not nesting and the cowbirds are going farther afield to find nests. In support of this theory, Jan and Will Risser recently reported a blue-gray gnatcatcher feeding a juvenile cowbird near the top of the Pinnacles Trail, an area where I wouldn't expect to find cowbirds.

Continued monitoring of Peregrine falcons revealed 9 active eyries (compared to 6 last year) with 13 known fledglings (as compared to 3 last year). Previously I reported that there was no activity along the southeast rim of the Chisos, but follow-up monitoring revealed a well hidden nest site from which two fledglings were produced.

As an interesting side note, once the rains started in June, hummingbirds virtually vanished from lower elevations throughout the area, a phenomena I haven't noticed before. Lucifers, which are hard to find at any time away from a feeder, were completely absent, and even black-chins were scarce. Presumably they moved to higher elevations to take advantage of the few agaves and other wildlfowers that bloomed in the wake of the abundant rainfall. By mid-July however, they returned in droves, joined by migrating rufous hummingbirds beginning July 22.

### BIG BEND NATIONAL PARK RARE BIRD RECORDS AUGUST-NOVEMBER, 2000

Attached is a list of observations reported by visitors and staff for the period August 1 - November 30. I've compiled only those observations for species which are listed as Rare, Accidental, Hypothetical or Not included (?) on the park's checklist.

The drought conditions of the summer continued into the early portion of the reporting period, then suddenly reversed in October with the arrival of heavy downpours. Rain has continued to fall on through November, including one major snowstorm that dropped almost six inches on Panther Junction and the Chisos Basin on November 7. The tremendous rainfall of the past two months has re-greened the desert and brought an uncharacteristic late bloom of wildflowers. Year to date precipitation as compared to ytd totals through November 1999(+ or -) is as follows: Panther Junction; 13.35" (+3.56"), Chisos Basin; 15.70" (-0.01"), Rio Grande Village; 9.68" (+2.89"), Castolon; 10.00" (-0.35"), and Persimmon Gap; 8.80" (-3.40").

This Fall season basically broke down into two seasons; a warm, dry early fall through August and September, followed by a wet, cool late fall punctuated with the passage of several major cold fronts from late September through November. Highlights of the former included a least grebe that was present at the Rio Grande Village nature trail from August 29 through September 20, representing a first fall record for this species in the park. An unusual report was that of two flammulated owls at Dugout Wells on September 2, one of just a very few lower elevation reports for this species in the park. Ruby-throated and Calliope hummingbirds made a good showing in this early season with several reports coming in, and Lucifer hummingbirds lingered well into October (last date 10/14) even after the passage of a major cold front. Ro Wauer found three dusky-capped flycatchers at Boot Springs on September 6 (documentation submitted to TBRC). The report raises interesting questions; were these the same dusky-caps that nested earlier along the Laguna Meadow Trail for a first Texas nesting record, or were they another pair that was overlooked, or just post-breeding vagrants?. Wauer also found a graycheeked thrush on September 9 in Boot Canyon, yet another first fall record for the park. Warbler highlights included two prothonotary warblers (8/29 & 9/1), a Louisiana waterthrush (9/18) and the only report this year of **red-faced** warbler on August 14 from along the Colima trail in the high Chisos. The latter report followed exactly one year to the day from the last red-faced warbler observation in the Chisos.

The second season began with the passage of a cold front through the area on September 20. With the front came an initial influx of Townsend's solitaires, American pipits and pine siskins, followed by a surprising showing of pinyon jays in and around the Chisos Mountains from September 29 through October 5. While Big Bend didn't have the showing that the Davis Mountains area did for pinyon jays this fall, the several observations were enough documentation to move pinyon jay from "hypothetical" to the main park checklist. An interesting sidenote was a report from park superintendent Frank Deckert after a visit to the Maderas del Carmen Protected Area in Mexico on September 26. There he saw four Clark's nutcrackers, an observation that presaged the later sightings of nutcrackers in the Davis Mountains area. Unfortunately, no reports of this species came from within park boundaries.

The only report of **red crossbills** came from along the Pinnacles Trail on October 3, the same day that Cassin's finches began showing up in the park.

Another first fall record was a double-crested cormorant that was present at the Rio Grande Village nature trail from October 26 to November 1. The snowstorm that hit the park on November 7 brought down an adult snow goose on the main park road (Rte 13). The goose lingered along the road for several days and apparently died from exposure before being relocated on the  $10^{\rm th}$ .

In keeping with the influx of montane species into the Trans-Pecos this late fall, Lewis's woodpeckers made brief appearances in the park. One woodpecker was observed behind the Chisos Mountains lodge over a two day period (11/01-02), and a second was reported recently (11/24) down the Window Trail. Attempts to relocate the birds have been unsuccessful. Brian Gibbons, Steve Pike, and Alan Wormington found golden-crowned kinglets on the same day (11/17) at opposite ends of the park, and turned the same trick with two winter wrens. Both species were found down along the river, unusual locations for both, but on that day the higher elevations were locked in a freezing fog, driving birds and birders to lower and warmer locales.
