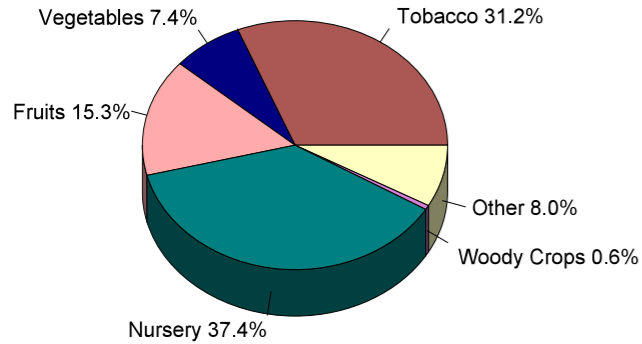
Patrick County is situated partly on the Piedmont Plateau and partly in the Blue Ridge Mountains. Formed from part of Henry in 1790, the county is the second in Virginia to be named after Patrick Henry.

Altitudes in the county vary widely, from 900 feet above sea level in southeastern regions to 3,200 feet on the mountain peaks. About one-third of the county lies on the Blue Ridge Plateau, where altitude are more uniform and range from 2,900 to 3,000 feet above sea level. Temperatures average 39 degrees in January and 75 in July. Annual precipitation for the area averages 49 inches. The frost-free growing season usually extends from April 12 to around October 25, generally averaging 196 days.

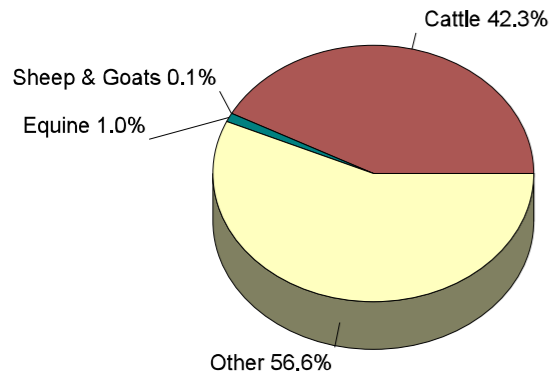
