Stem Cell Bills—Agreement: A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that on Tuesday, April 10, 2007, Senate begin consideration of S. 5, to amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for human embryonic stem cell research, and S. 30, en bloc; that there be a limitation of 20 hours for concurrent debate on the bills; that the Majority Leader, the Republican Leader, Mr. Harkin, and Mr. Brownback, or their designees, each control 5 hours therein; that no amendments or motions be in order to either bill; that, upon conclusion of debate, the bills, en bloc, be read the third time; that at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Republican Leader, Senate vote on final passage of the bills; that Senate first vote on passage of S. 5, and that there be 2 minutes, equally divided and controlled, for debate between the Majority and Republican Leaders, or their designees, between the votes; provided further, that if either bill

fails to pass with a minimum of 60 yeas votes, S. 5 be returned to the calendar, and S. 30 be placed on the calendar; and that, if either bill is passed, a motion to reconsider be deemed made and laid on the table.
