Organization and Assignments

Course requirements include reading, discussion, and four papers. In addition, each student will take a turn starting off the discussion of the reading. Class discussion is an important part of the course, and you should prepare for each class meeting by completing the readings assigned for that week. The first paper, of two pages, will be due at the second class meeting on September 5. The second, third, and fourth papers, of five pages each, will be due in class on October 3, October 31, and December 5, respectively. You can find guidelines for writing these papers, and for starting class discussion, on the separate handout called "Directions for papers and for discussion leaders".
