AMENDING SECTIONS 13-3401, 13-3404, 13-3404.01 AND 15-712, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO DRUG OFFENSES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 13-3401, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 13-3401. Definitions 5 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 6 1. "Administer" means to apply, inject or facilitate the inhalation or 7 ingestion of a substance to the body of a person. 8 2. "Amidone" means any substance identified chemically as 9 (4-4-diphenyl-6-dimethylamine-heptanone-3), or any salt of such substance, by whatever trade name designated. 10 11 3. "Board" means the Arizona state board of pharmacy. 12 4. "Cannabis" means the following substances under whatever names they 13 may be designated: 14 (a) The resin extracted from any part of a plant of the genus 15 cannabis, and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of such plant, its seeds or its resin. Cannabis does not include 16 17 oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any fiber, compound, 18 manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the mature stalks of 19 such plant except the resin extracted from the stalks or any fiber, oil or 20 cake or the sterilized seed of such plant which is incapable of germination. 21 (b) Every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or 22 preparation of such resin or tetrahydrocannabinol. 23 5. "Coca leaves" means cocaine, its optical isomers and any compound, 24 manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of coca leaves, except 25 derivatives of coca leaves which do not contain cocaine, ecgonine or 26 substances from which cocaine or ecgonine may be synthesized or made. 27 6. "Dangerous drug" means the following by whatever official, common, 28 usual. chemical or trade name designated: 29 (a) Any material, compound, mixture or preparation which contains any 30 quantity of the following hallucinogenic substances and their salts, isomers 31 and salts of isomers, unless specifically excepted, whenever the existence of 32 such salts, isomers and salts of isomers is possible within the specific 33 chemical designation: 34 (i) Alpha-ethyltryptamine. 35 (ii) Aminorex. 36 (ii) ALPHA-METHYLTRYPTAMINE. 37 (iii) 4-bromo-2, 5-dimethoxyphenethylamine. 38 (iv) 4-bromo-2, 5-dimethoxyamphetamine. 39 (v) Bufotenine. 40 (vi) Diethyltryptamine. 41 (vii) 2, 5-dimethoxyamphetamine. 42 (viii) 2, 5-DIMETHOXY-4-ETHYLAMPHETAMINE. 43 (ix) 2, 5- DIMETHOXY-4-(N)-PROPYLTHIOPHENETHYLAMINE (2C-T-7). 44 (viii) (x) Dimethyltryptamine. 45 (ix) (xi) 5-methoxy-3, 4-methylenedioxyamphetamine.

"Director" means the director of the department of health services. 25 9. "Dispense" means distribute, leave with, give away, dispose of or 26 deliver. 27 10. "Drug court program" means a program that is established pursuant 28 to section 13-3422 by the presiding judge of the superior court in 29 cooperation with the county attorney in a county for the purpose of 30 prosecuting, adjudicating and treating drug dependent persons who meet the 31 criteria and guidelines for entry into the program that are developed and 32 agreed on by the presiding judge and the prosecutor. 33 11. "Drug dependent person" means a person who is using a substance 34 that is listed in paragraph 6, 19, 20, 21 or 28 of this section and who is in 35 a state of psychological or physical dependence, or both, arising from the 36 use of that substance. 37 "Federal act" has the same meaning prescribed in section 32-1901. 12. 38 "Isoamidone" means any substance identified chemically as 13. 39 (4-4-diphenyl-5-methyl-6-dimethylaminohexanone-3), or any salt of such 40 substance, by whatever trade name designated. 41 14. "Isonipecaine" means any substance identified chemically as

43 such substance, by whatever trade name designated.

15. "Ketobemidone" means any substance identified chemically as
 (4-(3-hydroxyphenyl)-1-methyl-4-piperidylethyl ketone hydrochloride), or any
 salt of such substance, by whatever trade name designated.

4 16. "Licensed" or "permitted" means authorized by the laws of this 5 state to do certain things.

"Manufacture" means produce, prepare, propagate, compound, mix or 6 17. 7 process, directly or indirectly, by extraction from substances of natural 8 origin or independently by means of chemical synthesis, or by a combination 9 of extraction and chemical synthesis. Manufacture includes any packaging or 10 repackaging or labeling or relabeling of containers. Manufacture does not 11 include any producing, preparing, propagating, compounding, mixing. 12 processing, packaging or labeling done in conformity with applicable state 13 and local laws and rules by a licensed practitioner incident to and in the 14 course of his licensed practice.

15 18. "Manufacturer" means a person who manufactures a narcotic or 16 dangerous drug or other substance controlled by this chapter.

17 19. "Marijuana" means all parts of any plant of the genus cannabis, 18 from which the resin has not been extracted, whether growing or not, and the 19 seeds of such plant. Marijuana does not include the mature stalks of such 20 plant or the sterilized seed of such plant which is incapable of germination.

20. "Narcotic drugs" means the following SUBSTANCES AND THEIR SALTS, 22 whether of natural or synthetic origin and any substance neither chemically 23 nor physically distinguishable from them:

17 A. Instruction on the nature and harmful effects of alcohol, tobacco, narcotic drugs, marijuana, date rape drugs and other dangerous drugs on the 18 19 human system and instruction on the laws related to the control of these 20 substances and the nonuse and prevention of use and abuse of alcohol, 21 tobacco, narcotic drugs, marijuana, date rape drugs and other dangerous drugs 22 may be included in the courses of study in common and high schools, with 23 emphasis on grades four through nine. Instruction on the nature and harmful 24 effects of alcohol, tobacco, narcotic drugs, marijuana, date rape drugs and 25 other dangerous drugs on a human fetus may be included in the courses of 26 study in grades six through twelve. The instruction may be integrated into 27 existing health, science, citizenship or similar studies and shall meet the 28 criteria for chemical abuse prevention education programs developed pursuant 29 to subsection C of this section.

B. At the request of a school district, the department of education shall provide technical assistance to school districts that choose to implement programs to prevent chemical abuse.

C. The department of education and the department of health services, in consultation with the committee COUNCIL established pursuant to section 41-617, shall establish an interagency committee to coordinate their assistance to school districts.

37 D. The state board of education may accept gifts and grants and shall 38 distribute them and monies appropriated for chemical abuse prevention 39 programs to school districts to assist with the costs of programs designed to 40 prevent chemical abuse by pupils in kindergarten programs and grades one 41 through twelve. School districts which have approved chemical abuse 42 prevention policies and procedures as prescribed in section 15-345 are 43 eligible for a maximum of one dollar for each pupil or one thousand dollars, 44 whichever is more. If sufficient monies are not available to meet all 45 requests, the state board shall determine which school districts to fund

based on need, availability of other programs or sources of revenue and the likelihood of the school district's proposed program successfully meeting needs identified by the school district. A school district shall include the monies it receives for chemical abuse prevention programs under this section in the special projects section of the budget as provided in section 15-903, subsection F.
